Day 1: (Tue) Jun 4 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu via Hawaiian Airlines

 \rightarrow Meet the Panda Travel representative 3 hours prior to departure at the Hawaiian Airlines check-in counters.

Day 2: (Wed) Jun 5 – Chitose-Sapporo New Otani Inn Sapporo (Free WiFi)

→ Arrive at Chitose Airport and meet your local English speaking guide at the arrival lobby. We'll then transfer to New Otani Inn Sapporo, our accommodation for the next 3 nights.

Day 3: (Thu) Jun 6 – Sapporo (B) New Otani Inn Sapporo (Free WiFi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

 \rightarrow 9:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour around Sapporo.

→ 9:30am – Our morning begins with a visit to Sapporo Central Wholesale Market, also known as Jogai. This market offers some of the freshest fish and marine delicacies in Japan. At the "Curb Market," you can find approx. 60 stores selling everything from fruits, seasonal goods and local Hokkaido specialties.

→ 11:00am – Onto our next adventure, Okurayama Ski Jump Stadium. Constructed in 1931, the stadium was home to the 90m ski jump competition during the 1972 Sapporo Winter Olympic Games and is still used for competitions today. Together, we'll ride a ski lift to the peak where a viewing lounge will provide us with a spectacular view of Sapporo, the Ishikari Plain, and Ishikari Bay. This is also the ideal location to view the start line of the ski jump - look below at the steep slope to put yourself in the skiers' boots right before they begin their jumps!

→ 12:30pm – Enjoy lunch on your own at Sapporo Ramen Yokocho, a bustling tourist hub of 17 renowned Sapporo ramen eateries. Choose from a variety of ramen flavors from Sapporo classics to inventive ingredient combinations.

→ 1:45pm – Join local shoppers and enthusiasts at

Sapporo's oldest covered shopping arcade (since 1868!), the **Sapporo Tanukikoji Shopping Street.** This historic landmark stretches 10 blocks and features over 200 merchant stalls from the old world and the new, selling traditional goods like kimonos and tea sets alongside electronics and tech accessories. You'll also find Hawaii favorites like a multistory Daiso, a 24-hour Mega Don Quijote, and a variety of dining options that you can browse through.

→ 4:00pm – Return to hotel. The remainder of the day is yours at leisure.

Day 4: (Fri) Jun 7 – Sapporo-Otaru-Sapporo (B) New Otani Inn Sapporo (Free WiFi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

\rightarrow 8:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour in Otaru.

→ 9:30am – Our first visit this morning will be at the longstanding kamaboko fish paste company, Kamaei Kamaboko Store. At the conclusion of our tour, sample fresh kamaboko and shop around for some specialty goods.

→ 10:45am – Next, explore Otaru Sakaimachi Street, an avenue lined with Otaru's famous glassworks, music boxes, and sweet shops. As you near the end of Sakaimachi Street, you'll come across the Music Box Museum's renowned vintage clock. The museum houses 15,000 music boxes playing a variety of sounds including classical concertos, hits from the Beatles, and the latest J-pop tunes. As a highlight of your visit, delight in a hands-on music box making experience where you'll craft your own musical masterpiece.

Another must visit is the **Kitaichi Glass Shop**, which was once a glass supplier for the Otaru fishing community and is now a store filled with beautiful glassworks. For a sweet time, visit the **Kitakaro confectionery shop** and try the famous multi-layered honey wheeled cakes that have a cultlike following.

Enjoy free time with lunch on your own - try a soft serve cone from **Yamanaka Dairy Farm** as you stroll past locally crafted music boxes and glassware, or sample fresh local seafood at one of the many restaurants in the area. **LeTAO Plus**, a memorable sweet shop, has 50 varieties of cakes and sweets, a cafe on the 2nd floor, and a free observatory on the 3rd floor.

→ 3:00pm – Later today, we'll visit Royce' Cacao & Chocolate Town. This brand new facility (launched in Nov 2022) takes visitors through an immersive factory experience. Here, we'll learn how cocoa beans transform into chocolate bars, browse through Royce's antique collections, and delight in the baked sweets, soft serve ice cream, and 200 types of chocolate available at their on-site shop.

 \rightarrow 5:15pm – Return to hotel. Enjoy the rest of the evening at leisure.

Day 5: (Sat) Jun 8 – Sapporo-Noboribetsu (B/D) Iwainoyado Noboribetsu Grand Hotel (Free WiFi) - Enjoy onsen

→ Breakfast at hotel.

 \rightarrow 8:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour to Noboribetsu.

→ 10:00am – Our morning begins with a visit to Upopoy

National Ainu Museum and Park, Hokkaido's first national museum and Japan's first national museum dedicated to the indigenous Ainu people of northern Japan. At this open-air facility, we'll learn about the rich and vibrant Ainu culture through hundreds of native artifacts, a replica Ainu village, and more!

→ 12:15pm – Now a trip back in time to historic Japan

at the **Noboribetsu Date Jidaimura Village**, a charming Edo Period theme park with replica Edo-era architecture, traditional games and activities, and costumed ninjas, samurais, and geishas strolling the village streets. And at 1:30pm, we'll catch an exhilarating live **Ninja show!** Enjoy lunch on your own and an afternoon of wandering through samurai exhibits and outwitting the tricks and traps of the kid-friendly Ninja Maze.

→ 3:15pm – Welcome to Noboribetsu Jigokudani, an

otherworldly land of bubbling hot waters, steaming pools, and bleached rocks. Beloved by the Hokkaido people and recognized as a "Hokkaido Heritage" site, this productive crater feeds 10,000 tons of natural hot spring waters to onsen hotels and resorts in the area daily.

→ 4:15pm – Arrive at Iwainoyado Noboribetsu Grand

Hotel, followed by a buffet dinner at 6pm. Tonight's hotel is one of Japan's leading onsen resorts, having even previously provided lodging for a Japanese Emperor and Empress. Be sure to check out the various onsite hot spring amenities like an open-air Japanese garden bath with waterfalls, a Roman style bath, and more.

Day 6: (Sun) Jun 9 – Noboribetsu-Hakodate (B)

La Vista Hakodate Bay (Free WiFi) - Enjoy onsen

→ Breakfast at hotel.

 \rightarrow 8:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour to Hakodate.

→ 9:30am – Our morning begins with a sightseeing boat cruise on Lake Toya. Located at the center of Toya-Usu UNESCO Global Geopark, scenic Lake Toya features gorgeous scenery, wildlife, and natural landscapes. The lake was also designated as one of Japan's Top 100 Tourist Sites! During our leisurely cruise, be on the lookout for the wild ezo deer inhabiting Nakanoshima Island and the seagulls soaring above.

→ 11:15am – Next, a visit to UNESCO Geopark Showa Shinzan, a lava dome born from Mount Usu's 1943 volcanic eruption. Explore and enjoy some free time for lunch at this astounding natural landmark.

→ 3:15pm – Here we are at Michino-eki Shikabe Kanketsusen Park, the home of an incredible geyser that spouts over 50 ft of volcanic steam at 10-15 min intervals. → 5:30pm – Arrive at La Vista Hakodate Bay. This onsen hotel features 6 types of hot spring baths with spectacular night views of Hakodate. It's also located on the waterfront of the Kanemori Red Brick Warehouse District, a site that has earned a spot on the Michelin Green Guide!

→ 7:30pm – After dinner on your own, meet your guide at the hotel lobby. Time to explore Mt. Hakodate!

→ 8:00pm – Now a ride on the famous Hakodate Ropeway. Our cable car will take us to the Mount Hakodate observatory with panoramic views so remarkable it earned a 3 star recommendation from the Michelin Green Guide– the highest rank!

 \rightarrow 9:30pm – Return to hotel.

Day 7: (Mon) Jun 10 – Hakodate-Sapporo (B/D) New Otani Inn Sapporo (Free WiFi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

 \rightarrow 8:45am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a drive to Sapporo. Your suitcase will be delivered by courier service from Hakodate to your hotel in Sapporo on the same day.

 \rightarrow 9:15am – Along the way, we'll visit Goryokaku Tower. The tower's observatory overlooks Goryokaku, the star shaped fortress built by the Shogunate in 1857 to protect northern Japan, as well as the beautiful surrounding scenery that changes with the seasons.

→ 11:15am – Now, we are at the Hakodate Morning Market. Spanning 4 city blocks, this bustling marketplace of 250 stalls sells everything from fresh seafood, fruits, and vegetables to regional delicacies and souvenirs.

 \rightarrow 1:31pm – We'll take a Limited Express Train ride from Hakodate Station to Sapporo.

 \rightarrow 5:30pm – After arriving at Sapporo Station, we'll make our way to enjoy kani (crab) dinner.

→ 8:00pm – Arrive at New Otani Inn Sapporo. Enjoy the evening at leisure.

Day 8: (Tue) Jun 11 – Sapporo-Free Day at Leisure (B) New Otani Inn Sapporo (Free WiFi)

→ Breakfast at hotel. Enjoy your free day to explore Sapporo!

Day 9: (Wed) Jun 12 – Sapporo-Chitose-Honolulu (B)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

 \rightarrow 9:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour around Sapporo.

 \rightarrow 10:00am – Begin the day with a visit to Shiroi Koibito Park, a whimsical theme park with a central mascot that's especially exciting: chocolate! Operated by famed local chocolate company, Ishiya, this theme park is known for its flagship confectionery, a buttery cookie sandwich with a thin white chocolate in between. Be sure to take home some cookies (the best Sapporo souvenirs!).

→ 11:15am – Our next stop will be AEON Mall Sapporo Hassamu, a sprawling shopping center full of clothing shops, specialty stores, restaurants and more.

→ 2:15pm – On our way to the airport, we'll stop at the Chitose Salmon Aquarium. Historically, salmon was an important resource for the indigenous Ainu people and it continues to be a food staple in Hokkaido today. At this aquarium, we'll learn more about the cultural impact of this aquatic icon and peer inside its world in Japan's first "underwater observation room."

→ We'll now take a moment to explore Michi-no-eki Salmon Park Chitose, a rest area located along a National Highway that connects Chitose and Otaru. Unique to this complex is the Chitose River that runs by, with sights of salmon swimming upstream in autumn. Salmon Park Chitose also features a grocery store, restaurant, cafes, souvenir shops, and salmon focused products.

 \rightarrow 4:00pm – Arrive at New Chitose Airport to begin our check-in process for the flight home.

- → Depart from Chitose via Hawaiian Airlines.
- → Arrive in Honolulu (same day).
