

Day 1: (Tue) Oct 15 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu via Hawaiian Airlines

 \rightarrow Meet your Panda Travel representative 3 hours prior to departure at the Hawaiian Airlines check-in counters.

Day 2: (Wed) Oct 16 – Haneda

Hotel JAL City Haneda Tokyo West Wing (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Arrive at Haneda Airport, meet your English speaking local assistant at the arrival lobby, and then we'll transfer to Hotel JAL City Haneda Tokyo West Wing, our accommodations for the night.

Day 3: (Thu) Oct 17 – Haneda-AKJ-Furano-Biei-Asahikawa (B) The JR Inn Asahikawa (Free Wi-Fi) - Enjoy onsen

→ Breakfast at hotel

→ Depart Haneda to Asahikawa via ANA/All Nippon Airways (TBA).

→ Arrive at Asahikawa Airport. Meet your English speaking local guide at the arrival lobby. We'll transfer to begin our tour by chartered coach.

→ 10:45am – First, a visit to Tomita Farm. With Daisetsuzan National Park as a backdrop and colorful flowers and plants like spider flowers and perpetual flowers, this is easily one of the most photographed spots in Hokkaido. Enjoy the flower farm and its phenomenal autumn landscapes.

→ 12:15pm – Grab lunch on your own at Furano Marche, a cluster of approx. 20 shops in the heart of downtown Furano. Popular foods include ramen, burgers, takoyaki, rice ball varieties, freshly made ice cream, and much more!

→ 2:15pm – Next, a visit to Biei Blue Pond, a stunning blue body of water that changes its hue depending on the viewing angle and time of day. During this season, the vibrant hues of autumn leaves come to life, creating a mesmerizing tapestry of reds and yellows that mirror in the tranquil pond. Take pleasure in this extraordinary display of colors.

→ 4:15pm – Now we are at the acclaimed Otokoyama

Sake Brewery, which was founded in 1661 and became the official sake-maker for aristocrats during the Edo period. Otokoyama garnered fame as the 1st Japanese sake to earn the prestigious Monde Selection award in 1977 and has won 40+ gold medals internationally since then.

Otokoyama's sake is so spectacular in part because it is brewed using the underground springwater that runs deep beneath the Hokkaido mountains. In addition to learning all about Otokoyama's sake brewing process and rich heritage, you'll have time to sample their world renowned sake and browse through magnificent sake sets and cups at their gift shop.

→ 5:30pm – Arrive at JR Inn Asahikawa. Our hotel is connected to the JR Asahikawa Station and a direct elevator down to the AEON Mall. The city's shopping arcade entrance is also steps away. Besides its location, the hotel offers a public bath in a semi-outdoor setting. Enjoy the evening at leisure.

Day 4: (Fri) Oct 18-

Asahikawa-Sounkyo-Lake Notoro-Lake Saroma (B/L/D) Lake Saroma Tsuruga Resort (Free Wi-Fi) - Enjoy onsen

→ Breakfast at hotel.

\rightarrow 8:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby.

→ 9:15am – This morning, we take a step into the magical snow and ice-covered world of the Hokkaido Ice Pavilion. After entering through a tunnel of lights and a mirror maze, we'll pick up a thick winter coat before proceeding to the -20°C zone of ice and giant icicle covered walls. Here you'll find the air glittering with "diamond dust" or tiny ice crystals that form from the moisture in the air, just as it does on particularly cold Hokkaido days. Be sure to also keep an eye out for the tank of "ice angels," beautiful and almost alienlike sea slugs with delicate wings that live under the drift ice in the sea north of Hokkaido.

→ 10:30am – Now a stop at renowned Kamikawa Taisetsu Shuzo gift shop and brewery. Here, we'll take a behind the scenes look at how contemporary artisans have used traditional techniques with modern technology to transform grains of rice into top quality sake. We'll also venture into their gift shop, which offers a vast selection of sake varieties.

 \rightarrow 11:30am – Time for a western lunch at Fratello di Mikuni by Chef Miyamoto, which was awarded a Michelin Star in 2017. In addition to the beautiful surrounding natural scenery, the restaurant's use of fresh, locally sourced ingredients in its Italian inspired dishes create a memorable culinary experience that is unique to Hokkaido.

→ 1:45pm – After lunch, we'll visit two of Hokkaido's most beautiful waterfalls. Surrounded by vibrant autumn foliage, Ginga Falls drapes over the rocks like a white curtain while Ryusei Falls rushes out from behind the cliff face like a natural jetstream.

→ 4:30pm – Arrive at Lake Saroma Tsuruga Resort,

followed by a buffet dinner at 6:30pm. Our onsen hotel is situated on the shore of Lake Saroma. The hotel boasts a large hot spring public bath called "Wakka no Yu," which is known for its excellent heat retention properties.

Day 5: (Sat) Oct 19 – Lake Saroma-Abashiri-Shiretoko (B/L/D) Shiretoko Daiichi Hotel (Free Wi-Fi) - Enjoy onsen

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 8:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby as we are off for a full day of touring.

→ 10:45am – This morning, we'll take a walk along the Shiretoko Five Lakes Wooden Pathways, a captivating destination nestled within a primeval forest of a UNESCO World Heritage site. Enjoy the vibrant colors of fall along your scenic 1 mile walk on the elevated wooden path (~40 min. walk).

→ 12:15pm – Now we'll drive to Shiretoko National Park, a tranquil sanctuary located at the northeastern tip of Hokkaido. This UNESCO World Heritage site is renowned for its scenic beauty and serves as an important habitat for wildlife, such as brown bears, deer, and foxes.

→ 2:00pm – After enjoying a Japanese-style lunch at a local restaurant, we'll make a stop at Michino-eki Utoro, a popular roadside station at the entrance of Shiretoko National Park. As you visit the information center and gift shop, take in the impressive coastal views and get a glimpse into the rich cultural heritage of the region.

→ 2:45pm – Experience the Shiretoko Cruise Aurora,

a 90-minute sightseeing cruise along the coast of the Shiretoko Peninsula. Known as Japan's last frontier, this cruise offers untouched viewing areas that showcase breathtaking scenery. Capture stunning photos of tall cliffs, waterfalls, and sea caves in a panoramic setting. Keep an eye out for a variety of wildlife, including brown bears, Yezo deer, Ezo red foxes, white-tailed eagles, Steller's Sea eagles, and Blakiston's fish owls. Watch as seals, dolphins, blacktailed gulls, and Japanese cormorants play in the sea.

→ 4:30pm – Arrive at Shiretoko Daiichi Hotel, followed by a buffet dinner at 6:00 pm. The hotel is set on high ground overlooking the Sea of Okhotsk. Our onsen hotel features both indoor and outdoor natural hot spring baths. Enjoy a relaxing time surrounded by the views of this World Heritage Site.

Day 6: (Sun) Oct 20 – Shiretoko-Lake Akan (B/L/D)

Hotel Lake Akan Tsuruga Wings - Lake view rooms (Free Wi-Fi) - Enjoy onsen

→ Breakfast at hotel.

 \rightarrow 8:30am – Meet your guide at the lobby for a full day tour to Lake Akan.

→ 8:45am – The morning begins with a short drive to Oshinkoshin Waterfall, a powerful waterfall that marks the entrance to Shiretoko. Known as the "Twin Beauties Waterfall," a reference to the split in its waters halfway down, this incredible natural wonder has even earned a spot on Japan's official "100 Waterfalls of Japan" list. From the observatory, you can enjoy views of the Sea of Okhotsk and the Shiretoko mountain range.

→ 10:15am – Next, a fun visit to the Kiyosato Shochu

Distillery. Located amidst endless fields of potatoes, this unique town-run brewery is recognized as the first in Japan to innovatively use potatoes to manufacture Japanese shochu. The tour includes a backstage view of the entire production process, from potato mashing to distillation. At the conclusion of the tour, enjoy taste testing three shochu varieties, ranging from mild to super strong.

\rightarrow 12:00pm – Time to enjoy a Japanese-style lunch at a local restaurant.

→ 1:30pm – Here we are at Akan Mashu National Park's Lake Mashu, which many regard as Japan's most beautiful lake. One of the "clearest lakes in the world," Lake Mashu is also one of Japan's deepest lakes and can often be seen shrouded in a fog, an added mystique to this already enchanting site.

→ 3:30pm – Arrive at Hotel Lake Akan Tsuruga Wings, a stylish and contemporary hot spring Ryokan conveniently situated along the town's main street: Ainu Koton. Before

dinner, take a leisurely stroll along Ainu Koton's shops, many of which stay open late into the evening. You may also find yourself unwinding at the hotel's famous onsen or browsing through the vast collection of indigenous and local artworks displayed on the hotel lobby floor.

 \rightarrow 6:00pm – Tonight, we'll dine on a delightful array of dishes at the hotel's **buffet dinner.** Following our meal, we will take a short stroll to the theater in Akan Ainu Kotan Village, where we will be treated to a **traditional Ainu fire dance show**, a beautiful performance portraying the Ainu lifestyle through songs and dances.

→ 9:15pm – After the show, we'll walk back to our hotel. The remainder of the evening is yours to unwind and enjoy.

Day 7: (Mon) Oct 21 – Lake Akan-Tomamu (B/D) Hoshino Resort Tomamu (Free Wi-fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

\rightarrow 8:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for another fun-filled day of touring.

→ 9:45am – Our morning begins with a visit to the Akan International Crane Center. This facility is a unique combination of a museum, a breeding center, and a sanctuary where cranes can be observed year-round. Its primary mission is to conserve the tancho crane while also conducting research and providing information about these magnificent birds. Enjoy viewing the informative indoor displays and the tancho cranes being raised in their natural outdoor habitat.

→ 12:00pm – Time for some shopping and lunch on your own at Kushiro Washo Ichiba Market, also known as "the Citizen's Kitchen." One of the top 3 markets in Hokkaido, this historic indoor fish market features fresh seafood, meats, produce, and confections. Dazzle in the brilliant sights and listen to "wasshoi wasshoi" fill the market, enthusiastic calls for goods and trade. Meander through the 60+ shops and perhaps delight in creating your own bowl of Katte Don, a tailor-made seafood donburi and one of the famous attractions here.

→ 3:00pm — Next, we are off to Ikeda Wine Factory, also known as the "Ikeda Wine Castle" for its resemblance to a medieval European castle, is one of Ikeda Town's specialties. Enjoy some free time exploring the exhibition rooms displaying grape cultivation and winemaking techniques, as well as the wine maturation cellars. The factory also features a wine tasting area, a restaurant, and a shop selling wines and other local specialties.

→ 5:30pm – Arrive at Hoshino Resort Tomamu, followed by dinner at the hotel at 6pm. This all-season resort is famous for its winter ski activities. Explore the Mina-Mina Beach, Japan's largest indoor beach, or relax amidst nature with a stroll, hammock, or a drink on the spacious wooden deck while admiring the beautiful autumn scenery.

Day 8: (Tue) Oct 22 – Tomamu-Sapporo (B/L/D) New Otani Inn Sapporo (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

\rightarrow 9:00am – Meet your guide at the lobby as we embark our way to Sapporo, the capital of Hokkaido.

→ 10:30am – Our morning begins with a scenic drive to Yuni Garden, a stunning British-style garden where the beauty of autumn foliage comes alive. Take your time to leisurely stroll amidst a kaleidoscope of colorful flowers and a delightful array of herbs. By October, the landscape transforms into a captivating sight with over 30,000 red kochia bushes, complemented by the enchanting hues of maple trees and Japanese Ivy. Don't forget to visit the garden shop where they sell unique herbal cookies and teas that make perfect souvenirs to bring home.

→ 1:30pm – After a buffet lunch at Yuni Garden, we are on our next adventure: Royce' Cacao & Chocolate Town. This brand new facility (launched in Nov 2022) takes visitors through an immersive factory experience. We'll learn how cocoa beans transform into chocolate bars, browse through Royce's antique collections, and indulge in the baked sweets, soft serve ice cream, and 200 types of chocolate available at their on-site shop.

→ 3:45pm – Join local shoppers and enthusiasts at Sapporo's oldest covered shopping arcade (since 1868!), the Sapporo Tanukikoji Shopping Street. This historic landmark stretches 10 blocks and features over 200 merchant stalls from the old world and the new, selling traditional goods like kimonos and tea sets alongside electronics and tech accessories. You'll also find Hawaii favorites like a multistory Daiso and a 24-hour Mega Don Quijote.

 \rightarrow 5:30pm – Arrive at New Otani Inn Sapporo and enjoy some downtime.

 \rightarrow 6:15pm – Meet at the hotel lobby and make our way to enjoy kani (crab) dinner.

 \rightarrow 8:45pm – Return to hotel.

Day 9: (Wed) Oct 23 – Sapporo-Chitose-Haneda-Honolulu (B)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

 \rightarrow 8:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a half day tour before we are heading to New Chitose Airport.

→ 9:00am – This morning, a visit to Okurayama Ski Jump Stadium. Constructed in 1931, the stadium was home to the 90m ski jump competition during the 1972 Sapporo Winter Olympic Games and is still used for competitions today.

Together, we'll **ride a ski lift** to the peak where a viewing lounge will provide us with a spectacular view of Sapporo, the Ishikari Plain, and Ishikari Bay. This is also the ideal location to see the starting line of the ski jump - look below at the steep slope to put yourself in the skiers' boots right before they begin their jumps!

→ 10:30am – Now a stop at Sapporo Central Wholesale Market (Jogai), renowned for its fresh fish and produce in Japan. Explore the "Curb Market" with around 60 stores selling everything from fruits to seasonal goods. Beyond its culinary delights, Jojai also showcases the vibrant culture and lifestyle of Sapporo, serving as a lively gathering place for locals, chefs, and restaurateurs.

→ 12:30pm – Arrive at New Chitose Airport. We'll board an ANA/All Nippon Airways flight from Chitose to Haneda Airport. (TBA) → Upon arrival at Haneda, you will be greeted by your local English-speaking assistant at the arrival lobby. We'll shuttle to Terminal 3 for our flight home.

→ Depart Haneda via Hawaiian Airlines for Honolulu.

 \rightarrow Arrive in Honolulu (same day).
