#### Day 1: (Sun) Mar 16 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu via Hawaiian Airlines

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative 3 hours prior to departure at the Hawaiian Airlines check-in counters.

Day 2: (Mon) Mar 17 – Haneda-Tokyo Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Arrive at Haneda Airport, and meet your English speaking guide at the arrival lobby. We will then transfer to Sunshine City Prince Hotel, our accommodation for the night. Our hotel is directly connected to Sunshine City shopping center with many shopping and dining options available to you. Nearby, you'll also find a 24-hr Family Mart convenience store and a Seiyu supermarket for snack, bento, and beverage pickups. Enjoy your evening at leisure.

Day 3: (Tue) Mar 18 – Tokyo-Chichibu-Kumagaya/Saitama (B/D)

Toki No Yu Onsen Hotel Heritage (Free Wi-Fi) - Enjoy onsen

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour to Saitama.
- → 9:45am Our day kicks off with the leisurely Nagatoro River Boat Ride where skilled boatmen will steer our traditional Japanese boat along the Arakawa River and through a majestic valley to experience the most mesmerizing views of nature. Enjoy this fun, yet serene cruise!
- → 11:15am If you missed one of Japan's largest festivals last winter, don't fret as the **Chichibu Night Festival Museum** revives this glorious event for you to experience. Festival music, ornate floats, and intricate ornaments come together to recreate the thrill and excitement of this famous event. Happy celebrating!
- → 1:00pm Take some free time to explore and enjoy lunch on your own at Matsuri no Yu. Designed after Chichibu's famous festival, this exciting complex features shopping, and food areas. Check out the many eateries offering delectable Chichibu specialties like Waraji Katsudon (crispy pork cutlet rice bowl), Buta Miso Don (miso-marinated pork rice bowl), and miso potato.
- → 3:00pm In 2014, the Higashi Chichibu Japanesepaper Museum was granted UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage in recognition of its efforts to maintain the ancient traditions of Japanese paper making. Today, we'll take part in this cultural legacy first-hand by engaging with the timehonored craft of washi paper making.

→ 5:15pm – Arrive at Toki No Yu Onsen Hotel Heritage, a tranquil retreat tucked in nature. One of the top hotels in Saitama, this relaxing natural hot spring resort has also hosted members of the Imperial family, including the Emperor and Empress of Japan. And at 6:30pm, enjoy your Japanese-style dinner.

Day 4: (Wed) Mar 19 – Kumagaya/Saitama-Tokyo (B/L) Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 9:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby this morning to experience the charm of old Japan in this former castle town, Kawagoe. Discover Edo-style buildings, traditional architecture, vibrant festivals, and the birthplace of the iconic Kitsune mask (fox mask).
- → 10:00am Start the day with a stroll in Kawagoe or "Little Edo." Enjoy free time to browse, shop, and explore this former castle town, with its preserved Kurazukuri (clay-walled warehouses) and other historic buildings surrounding. A tip: visit the iconic Starbucks on Kanetsuki Dori Street. Located in an old warehouse, this iconic spot has become world famous and the best example of traditional meets modern.
- → 12:00pm Enjoy a Japanese style lunch at a local restaurant.
- → 1:00pm Here we are at Koedo Kurari, a celebrated brewing facility and nationally registered Tangible Cultural Property. The site houses a souvenir shop, a cafe, and a sake tasting room where visitors can sample sake from 30+ breweries strewn across the Saitama prefecture.
- → 2:00pm Next, a moment at 1,500 year old Hikawa Shrine. Today, many visit the shrine to pray for happiness in the family and luck in matchmaking. Here, visitors can also perform a "hitogata nagashi" purification ritual by releasing a human-shaped paper at the onsite river, make wishes, and improve their luck with "omikuji" or fortune slip readings.
- → 3:30pm Now a step inside a must-visit contemporary landmark in Japan: the Kadokawa Culture Museum in Tokorozawa Sakura Town. Completed in 2020, this architectural marvel pushes the boundaries of physics and design to create a futuristic cultural complex that celebrates Japanese arts and entertainment. A few highlights of this otherworldly museum: the massive "Bookshelf Theater" library containing 30,000 titles; the "Manga & Light Novel Library" with one of the largest manga collections in the world (35,000 manga literature!); the "EJ Anime Museum" and its immersive anime exhibits; the "Musashino Gallery,"

a VR and AR playground; and more!

→ 6:00pm – Arrive at Sunshine City Prince Hotel. Enjoy the remainder of the evening at leisure.

### Day 5: (Thu) Mar 20 – Tokyo (B)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 9:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour in Tokyo.
- → 9:30am Start our day at Shinjuku Gyoen National Garden, a prime destination for cherry blossom viewing with over 1,200 trees of various species that may be in bloom. The garden is divided into three distinct sections: the traditional Japanese landscape garden with serene ponds, islands, and bridges; the French garden, renowned for its romantic atmosphere and abundant flowers like roses; and the English landscape garden with expansive open lawns surrounded by flowering cherry trees. Beyond these themed areas, the park offers forested zones, additional lawns, a restaurant, an art gallery, and the stunning greenhouse showcases a diverse array of tropical and subtropical flora.
- → 11:00am Now, a stop at Harajuku & Omotesando, the heart of all things trendy and eccentric. More than just its colorful street art and its youth-driven quirky fashion culture, this area is also a haven for sweets like gigantic cotton candy, crepes, and cream puffs. There is also a multistory Daiso nearby.
- → 1:45pm Onto our next exciting Taiyaki making experience! This iconic golden fish-shaped pastry dates back hundreds of years to the Edo period, with its first iteration being a round-shaped cake filled with azuki bean paste. During this era, tai (sea bream fish) was highly prized seafood and was gifted to esteemed figures like the shogun. Overtime, tai evolved to become symbols of luck, prosperity, and happiness in Japanese culture.
- → 3:00pm Here we are at Asakusa's iconic Sensoji Temple and Kaminarimon Gate (aka "Thunder Gate") with its massive lantern. This spot is a "must see" in every guidebook and boasts over 30 million annual visitors. Traditionally, once you reach the top of the temple steps, you should clap twice and bow your head as a sign of respect. With the belief that coins trap the dangers of daily life, visitors also customarily make a small offering by tossing coins into a wooden rack, tossing away those dangers as well.

You'll also find the **Five Storied Pagoda** there. Regarded as one of the "Four Edo Pagodas," this nearly 174 foot monument stands to represent Tokyo's few remaining pagodas. As you roam through the temple grounds, you'll come across the **Nakamise Shopping Arcade**, a lively and extensive shopping street lined with good luck charms,

traditional goodies, and Japanese snacks.

→ 5:30pm – Return to hotel. Enjoy the evening at leisure!

Day 6: (Fri) Mar 21 – Tokyo/Free day at leisure (B) Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

- → After breakfast, enjoy your free day to explore Tokyo!
- → If you've already experienced Sunshine City shopping mall, take a visit to Ikebukuro station and hop on a rail line that will connect you to other popular areas like Shinagawa, Shibuya, Shinjuku, Ueno, and Akihabara. Ikebukuro station is also close to our hotel.

#### Day 7: (Sat) Mar 22 – Tokyo-Haneda-Honolulu (B)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour in Tokyo.
- → 9:00am Our day begins with a visit to **Tsukiji Outer Market.** A renowned bucketlist spot, Tsukiji is the largest fish market in the world. While the inner auction market relocated to Toyosu in 2018, the charm remains in its outer market. Be sure to enjoy all that the outer market has to offer, from seasonal produce and candy tasting to knifemaking artisan shops.
- → 11:30am Next, a visit to teamLab Planets TOKYO. Using technology and perspective, this immersive museum takes visitors through labyrinth-like rooms to experience fields of flowers, rooms with walls that appear to be composed of brightly lit geographic shapes, and other mesmerizing digital art displays.
- → 1:15pm Opened in Feb 2024, Toyosu Senkyaku Banrai is inspired by the historic streets of Tokyo. This Edo themed multi-story shopping and entertainment center treats visitors to a variety of boutiques, as well as eateries featuring specialty foods like Toyosu's signature fresh seafood and produce.
- → 3:15pm Now, we'll stop by Divercity Shopping Center. Located on the artificial island of Odaiba. This unique and massive landmark is one of the best shopping, dining, and entertainment complexes in Tokyo. Don't forget to take a moment to snap a photo in front of the famous Gundam Statue, towering at nearly 80 feet high. Enjoy shopping at this famous site.
- → 5:00pm Arrive Haneda Airport to begin our check-in process via Hawaiian Airlines for our flight home.
- → Arrive in Honolulu (same day).
