Itinerary

Day 1: (Sun) March 30 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative 3 hours prior to departure at the airline's check-in counters.

Day 2: (Mon) March 31 – Fukuoka-Hakata Hotel Clio Court Hakata (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Arrive at Fukuoka Airport.
- → Meet your guide at the arrival lobby. Transfer to Hotel Clio Court Hakata Our hotel is centrally located and adjacent to the JR Hakata Station which offers over 100s of stores, including major department stores like Hankyu and Tokyu Hands. Nearby, you can also find Kitte shopping mall (directly linked to the Hakata Station) and a large Daiso. There are also many restaurant options close by. We'll be staying here for the next 2 nights.

Day 3: (Tue) April 1 – Hakata-Yanagawa-Hakata (B/L) Hotel Clio Court Hakata (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 9:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby to get ready for our journey to Yanagawa.
- → 10:30am Our morning begins with a visit to Yanagawa, a traditional castle town built in 1588 that is known for its wide canals. Sit back and relax as we meander through the watery boulevards of the "Venice of Kyushu" on a donkobune, a traditional flat river boat steered with a 6.5 ft pole. During this 60 min cruise, our bamboo hatted boatmen will guide us around the many interesting sights of Yanagawa with cherry blossoms in bloom.
- → 11:30am Now, we're at Yanagawa Tachibana-tei Ohana, the former residence of the Tachibana family—a clan of feudal lords during the Sengoku and Edo periods. Designated as a national site of natural beauty, its garden boasts hundreds of 300 year old pine trees, 1500 garden stones, and 14 stone lanterns centered around a pond.
- → 12:30pm Enjoy Japanese style lunch at a local restaurant.
- → 3:00pm Return to hotel. The remainder of your day is free. Our local guide will show our tour members to Hakata Station, a shopping and entertainment area, if you're interested to visit.

Day 4: (Wed) April 2 – Hakata-Huis Ten Bosch-Nagasaki (B)

Hotel New Nagasaki (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- \rightarrow 8:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour to Nagasaki.
- → 10:00am Our morning begins with a visit to Huis Ten Bosch. This charming recreation of a 17th century Dutch town is completed with canals, windmills, gardens, and cobblestone streets, as large as Monaco. It was constructed in 1992 to commemorate the rich history shared between Japan and the Netherlands. True to its moniker as the "City of Flowers and Lights," the park features vibrant seasonal flowers that carpet the authentic European cityscape. The mix of European-style surroundings and the beautiful cherry blossoms makes it an unforgettable place to appreciate the splendor of both cultures. The park also offers several restaurants, shops, and much more. Enjoy lunch on your own.
- → 2:15pm Overlooking Hario Strait, Saikaibashi Park is a scenic destination with about 1000 cherry trees. It provides a vantage point to witness the mesmerizing whirlpools formed by the tidal currents, creating a picturesque backdrop for photography enthusiasts.
- → 4:15pm This afternoon, off to visit Glover Garden, a famous sightseeing cherry blossoms spot and an open-air museum, exhibiting mansions of former Western residents of Nagasaki. This is where English tradesmen who came to the trading port of Nagasaki settled. During the cherry blossom season, the garden transforms into a captivating spectacle as the cherry trees burst into vibrant hues of pink and white.
- → 5:30pm Arrive at Hotel New Nagasaki with the remainder of the evening at leisure. Our hotel is located a short walk from the Nagasaki Station as well as many shopping and dining options.

Day 5: (Thu) April 3 – Nagasaki-Shimabara-Kumamoto-Kirishima (B/L/D) Kirishima Hotel (Free Wi-Fi) - Enjoy Onsen

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour to Kirishima.
- → 8:15am The morning begins with a visit to Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Museum and Nagasaki Peace Memorial Park. Constructed in remembrance of the tragic devastation during WWII, this solemn, commemorative space seeks to serve as a reminder to strive for world peace. The

surrounding Peace Park features the famed 32 ft tall Peace Statue. With Buddhist influenced themes of love and mercy in mind, Nagasaki native Seibou Kitamura, sculpted the statue with its right hand pointing to the sky from where the atomic bombs fell and its left hand gesturing to its side to represent peace. The park's hundreds of cherry trees bring added beauty and calm to this historic space.

- → 11:00am Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant.
- → 1:40pm Now, take a 30 min ferry ride with Kumamoto Ferry from Shimabara Port to Kumamoto Port.
- → 2:10pm From here, we'll head to our hotel for the evening.
- → 5:00pm Arrive at Kirishima Hotel, followed by a Japanese style dinner at 6:30pm. The hotel's onsen is a great place to unwind after dinner and in the morning before our departure.

Day 6: (Fri) April 4 – Kirishima-Kagoshima-Kumamoto (B) Kumamoto Hotel Castle (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → Please prepare a small overnight bag for 1 night in Kumamoto.
- \rightarrow 8:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Kagoshima.
- → 9:00am Our morning begins with a visit to Kirishima Shrine. This holy place is central to the ancient mythology of Japan and is dedicated to the deity, Ninigi-no-Mikoto. Legend has it that Ninigi-no-Mikoto descended from heaven, married a princess, and began the lineage of Japanese emperors. He's claimed to be the great-grandfather of Japan's first emperor, Emperor Jimmu.

While volcanic eruptions have repeatedly destroyed this shrine, it has always been rebuilt. The bright red, ornately decorated buildings you see now were built in the early 18th century and are usually decked in cherry blossoms around late March.

- → 11:15am Next, we'll head to Senganen Garden, recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. With a history spanning over 350 years, the garden offers visitors a captivating glimpse into Japan's feudal past and the beauty of traditional historic buildings, landscaping, stone pathways, lush greenery, and varieties of cherry trees. Enjoy the fleeting beauty of cherry blossoms during this spring season.
- → 12:45pm Then, a visit to Tenmonkan Shopping Arcade a bustling and vibrant shopping street with approximately 1.2 kilometers for locals and tourists, offering a wide variety of shops, boutiques, restaurants, and entertainment venues.

- → 3:45pm From here, off to the Kagoshima Chuo Station for our bullet train ride to Kumamoto Station.
- → 4:41pm Once we arrive in Kumamoto, we'll transfer to our hotel, Kumamoto Hotel Castle. You can also explore a variety of shops and dining options just a stone's throw away. Enjoy the rest of the evening at leisure.

Day 7: (Sat) April 5 – Kumamoto-Beppu (B/L/D) Suginoi Hotel, Sora Tower (Free Wi-Fi) - Enjoy Onsen

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:45am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby.
- → 9:00am Our morning begins with a visit to the magnificent Kumamoto Castle. Its massive castle grounds and impressive hilltop design has been aptly described by Japanese statesman and naval engineer, Katsu Kaishu, as there being "no other castle like this castle." Although it is currently undergoing a complete restoration, we can marvel at this cultural landmark from the outside and enjoy the majestic scenes with 600 cherry trees surrounding.
- → 10:15am Just below the castle hill is Sakura no Baba, a bustling feudal era castle town with shops, restaurants, and a museum chronicling the history of Kumamoto.
- → 12:30pm Enjoy buffet lunch at a local restaurant.
- → 2:45pm Next, a visit to the famous sakura tree at Isshingyo no Ozakura Park. The Ozakura ("big cherry tree") was planted in memory of feudal warlord, Nakamura Hokinokami Korefuyu, who perished while valiantly defending Yazaki Castle. At 400 years old, this gargantuan tree towers at approximately 46 ft. in height and has a trunk circumference of 23 ft. The park is also considered to be one of Japan's top spots for cherry blossom viewing. Enjoy some free time here to explore.
- → 5:30pm Arrive at Suginoi Hotel, followed by dinner at 6:00pm. Our hotel features stunning views overlooking Beppu Bay and world-renowned hot springs, which are fed by the region's natural geothermal activity. Spend some time unwinding in the hotel's several indoor and outdoor hot spring baths and soak in the therapeutic benefits of the natural waters. To maximize our stay, we've reserved the newly constructed Sora Tower (opened Jan 2023).

Day 8: (Sun) April 6 – Beppu-Hakata (B/L) Hotel Clio Court Hakata (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Fukuoka.
- → 9:00am Our first visit this morning is the Beppu
 Ropeway, a remarkable attraction that takes visitors

on a captivating journey up the mountainside, offering panoramic views of Beppu city and the surrounding landscape. Don't miss the opportunity to immerse yourself in the picturesque scenery of cherry blossom season!

→ 10:30am — Now, a visit to 2 bubbling and steaming hot springs from a family of 8 Beppu onsens in the Jigoku Meguri ("Hell Tour").

Our first onsen sighting is Umi-Jigoku or "Sea Hell" for its beautiful cobalt blue. Despite being known as the "Hells of Beppu" for its unapproachable appearance and thermal temperatures of around 100 degrees, the hot springs are nationally acclaimed as a "place of scenic beauty."

Translated as "Blood Pond Hell," Chinoike-Jigoku is the oldest natural "hell pond" in Japan with a distinctive red hue colored by iron oxide.

Be sure to try the on site onsen eggs (boiled in the hot spring!) and "Jigoku Mushiyaki Pudding" (Pudding steamed in Hell).

- → 12:30pm Time for a one of a kind culinary experience at Geothermal Tourism Lab ENMA. Here, chefs cook with geothermal steam and natural hot spring water, resulting in unique volcanic infused flavored dishes.
- → 1:30pm After a Japanese style lunch, we'll head out to Hakata with a stop at Dazaifu Tenmangu Shrine. This shrine is one of Fukuoka's most popular destinations, with over 2 million visitors during the first 3 days of the New Year. Dedicated to famed prodigy in politics, literature, and poetry, Sugawara-no Michizane, this shrine honors Michizane as the god of academic achievements and is an especially sacred spot for Japanese youths from all over the country to pray for academic success during exam season.
- → 5:45pm Arrive at Hotel Clio Court Hakata. The remainder of the evening is yours at leisure.

Day 9: (Mon) April 7 – Hakata-Fukuoka-Honolulu (B)


- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 9:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour before we head to the airport.
- → 10:00am The morning begins with a visit to Maizuru Park. The park was built around Fukuoka castle ruins and is home to 1,000 cherry trees and other seasonal flora. Admire the natural beauty of this cherry blossom viewing spot while strolling along a tunnel of flowers!
- → 11:45am Next, a visit to the guardian shrine of Hakata: Kushida Shrine. The site of the famous and UNESCO recognized Hakata Gion Yamakasa Festival, Kushida Shrine is also home to Japan's largest Otafuku mask, a sacred 1,000 year old Ginkgo Tree, and the fountain of youth.

Worshippers also visit the shrine to pray for longevity and business success.

- → 12:30pm With a history spanning over 130 years, Nakasu Kawabata Shopping Arcade was the first merchant area in Hakata district which now hosts over 130 stores. ranging from traditional to modern, offering a vibrant array of apparel shops, restaurants, and specialty stores.
- → 3:00pm On the way to the airport, we'll stop by a hot spot in Fukuoka: Mitsui Shopping Park LaLaport Fukuoka (opened in Apr 2022), a large shopping complex that houses over 200 shops. Enjoy some last minute shopping at this popular destination for locals and visitors.
- → Transfer to Fukuoka Airport for our flight home.
- → Arrive in Honolulu (same day).
