Itinerary

Day 1: (Sat) Jun 7 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative 3 hours prior to departure at the airline's check-in counters.

Day 2: (Sun) Jun 8 – Haneda-Maihama

Tokyo Bay Maihama Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Arrive at Haneda Airport and meet your guide at the arrival lobby.

→ Welcome to Tokyo Bay Maihama Hotel, the official Tokyo Disney Resort® Hotel! During our 3 night stay, take advantage of the hotel's direct access to the Disney Resort Line monorail system. The monorail loops around the perimeter of the resort and will make several stops, including at the doorsteps of Tokyo Disneyland and DisneySea.

Day 3: (Mon) Jun 9 –Maihama/Tokyo Disneyland (B)

Tokyo Bay Maihama Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 8:15am — Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for the monorail ride to Tokyo Disneyland.

→ Get ready for an exhilarating day at **Tokyo Disneyland!** Explore the many Tokyo Disneyland exclusive attractions like its glass covered Victorian-style indoor World Bazaar and the Beauty and the Beast mini-land that stretches from Belle's village square to Beast's Castle. Don't miss out on the spectacular PhilharMagic show (revamped in Sept 2022) and new rides like The Happy Ride with Baymax! In between attractions, snack on a chewy Stormtrooper mochi or hot, fresh popcorn featuring flavors like curry, cookie cream, and garlic shrimp. Enjoy making fun memories today!

→ **Return to hotel** — The monorail will transport you back to the hotel when you decide to return and rest up for the next day's Disney adventure.

Day 4: (Tue) Jun 10 – Maihama/Tokyo DisneySea (B)

Tokyo Bay Maihama Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ The day is yours at **Tokyo DisneySea**, the 4th most visited theme park in the world! Excitingly, you'll step foot in the park's newly opened Northern European inspired expansion: Fantasy Springs. With rides, attractions, and foods from the massively popular Frozen, Tangled, and Peter Pan movies, you'll find Arendelle Castle in Frozen Kingdom, the floating lantern festival in Rapunzel's Forest, a pirate ship in Peter Pan's Neverland, and more! But the fun doesn't end there...drift along the Mediterranean Harbor on a Venetian gondola, descend to the ocean's depths in

the 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea submarine, explore caverns of mystery in a subterranean vehicle on the Journey to the Center of the Earth ride, and navigate a watercraft in Aquatopia. Fuel up with a gyoza dog, a tiramisu ice cream sandwich, or a tempura assortment plate. Have fun - Sea you later!

Day 5: (Wed) Jun 11 – Maihama-Nagoya (B)

The Cypress Mercure Nagoya (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Please leave your luggage (2 pcs per person) at the hotel and prepare an overnight bag for your 2-night stay in Nagoya. Your luggage(s) will be delivered by courier service from your hotel to Sunshine City Prince Hotel in Tokyo.

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 8:15am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby. This morning, we'll transfer by our chartered coach to Tokyo Station and board a bullet train to Nagoya.

→ 11:16am – Upon arriving at Nagoya Station, we'll proceed to our next destination.

→ 11:45am – Our first stop takes us to **Aeon Mall Nagoya Noritake Garden**, a large nature inspired shopping complex with over 150 shops, eateries, and entertainment facilities. Its most popular (and highly photographed) attraction is TSUTAYA BOOKSTORE Noritake Shinmachi's impressive wall of books. During your visit, choose from over 50 restaurants and enjoy lunch on your own.

→ 1:30pm – This afternoon, we'll discover the Toyota Group's evolution from an early 20th century textile machinery manufacturer to a modern day automobile industry behemoth at the **Toyota Commemorative Museum of Industry and Technology**. Housed in a redbrick building of one of Toyota's former textile manufacturing factories, the museum features metalwork demonstrations, interactive exhibits, and an exquisite collection of vintage vehicles.

→ 3:30pm – Next, a visit to **Nagoya Castle**, the first castle in Japan to be designated a National Treasure. Constructed as a seat of one of the three branches of the ruling Tokugawa family, this magnificent palace was one of the largest castles in Japan during the Edo Period.

→ 4:45pm – Arrive at **The Cypress Mercure Nagoya**. Our hotel is conveniently located a short walk to Nagoya Station, surrounded by a wide variety of shopping and dining options. The rest of the evening is yours at leisure.

Day 6: (Thu) Jun 12 – Nagoya/Legoland (B)

The Cypress Mercure Nagoya (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **9:15am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for the journey to the whimsical world of LEGO at LEGOLAND!**

→ **10:00am** — Constructed out of 17 million LEGO bricks, **LEGOLAND** features seven differently themed areas that include rides, shows, and interactive experiences. Venture to “Miniland Japan” to see a miniature replica of Japan’s famous landmarks made completely out of LEGO. Head over to “Adventure,” “LEGO City,” “Knight’s Kingdom” and “Pirate Shores” for thrilling and playful hands-on experiences. Want to learn more about the history and manufacturing of these famous bricks? Pop into “Factory” and “Bricktopia” where you can attend workshops and take a peek at the model building and creation room. This famous outdoor amusement park attracts all ages! Don’t forget to dive into the aquatic world at **SEA LIFE**, which is located steps away from LEGOLAND. As you make your way through the 11 themed areas, you can find an underwater palace at the Japanese fairy tale zone, stingrays gliding through waters in the tropical ocean zone, and some open displays where you can interact with marine life.

→ **1:45pm** – Time to explore the bustling **Osu shopping district**, a vibrant hub that has thrived for over 400 years and it hosts hundreds of shops, restaurants, Buddhist temples and entertainment options. It’s also home to many subcultural gatherings, including the popular World Cosplay Summit. Try fried chicken at Enshidajipai and keep an eye out for Aichi specialties like hitsumabushi (grilled eel over rice), miso katsu, and smoky red miso soup.

→ Now, we’ll drive by the buzzing **Sakae area**, where most of the city’s entertainment and shopping is concentrated, including: Oasis 21, a modern glass center for food, shopping and transportation and Nagoya TV Tower, modeled after Paris’ Eiffel Tower.

→ **4:00pm** — **Return to hotel.** The rest of the evening is yours at leisure.

Day 7: (Fri) Jun 13 – Nagoya-Tokyo (B)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **9:30am** – **Meet your guide at the hotel lobby. From here, we’ll walk to Nagoya Station where we’ll board a bullet train to Tokyo.**

→ **11:15am** – **After arriving at Tokyo Station, we’re off to Tsukiji.**

→ **12:00pm** – A renowned bucketlist spot, **Tsukiji Outer Market** is the largest fish market in the world. While the

inner auction market relocated to Toyosu in 2018, the charm remains in its outer market. Be sure to enjoy all that the outer market has to offer, from seasonal produce and candy tasting to knife-making artisan shops.

→ **2:30pm** – We’ll now visit **teamLab Planets TOKYO**. Using technology and perspective, this immersive museum takes visitors through labyrinth-like rooms to experience fields of flowers, rooms with walls that appear to be composed of brightly lit geographic shapes, and other mesmerizing digital art displays.

→ **4:30pm** – Arrive at **Sunshine City Prince Hotel**. Our hotel lobby directly connects to a huge shopping and entertainment complex with 4 towers that include an aquarium, planetarium, solarium, a virtual reality play experience, and a nearly 788 foot high skyscraper with an observation deck. In addition to the renowned Pokemon Center Mega Tokyo, Sunshine City is also home to Namja Town, a food and dessert theme park. Enjoy the evening of shopping and dining on your own.

Day 8: (Sat) Jun 14 – Tokyo-Free day at leisure (B)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **After breakfast, enjoy your free day to explore Tokyo!**

→ If you’ve already experienced Sunshine City shopping mall, take a visit to Ikebukuro station and hop on a rail line that will connect you to other popular areas like Shinagawa, Shibuya, Shinjuku, Ueno, and Akihabara. Ikebukuro station is also close to our hotel.

Day 9: (Sun) Jun 15 – Tokyo-Haneda-Honolulu (B)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **9:00am** – **Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour around Tokyo.**

→ **9:30am** – This morning begins with a fun and exciting **Taiyaki making experience!** This iconic golden fish-shaped pastry dates back hundreds of years to the Edo period, with its first iteration being a round-shaped cake filled with azuki bean paste. During this era, tai (sea bream fish) was highly prized seafood and was gifted to esteemed figures like the shogun. Overtime, tai evolved to become symbols of luck, prosperity, and happiness in Japanese culture.

→ **10:45am** – Here we are at **Asakusa’s** iconic **Sensoji Temple** and **Kaminarimon Gate** (aka “Thunder Gate”) with its massive lantern. This spot is a “must see” in every guidebook and boasts over 30 million annual visitors. Traditionally, once you reach the top of the temple steps, you should clap twice and bow your head as a sign of respect. With the belief that coins trap the dangers of daily life, visitors also customarily make a small offering by tossing

coins into a wooden rack, tossing away those dangers as well.

You'll also find the **Five Storied Pagoda** there. Regarded as one of the "Four Edo Pagodas," this nearly 174 foot monument stands to represent Tokyo's few remaining pagodas. As you roam through the temple grounds, you'll come across the **Nakamise Shopping Arcade**, a lively and extensive shopping street lined with good luck charms, traditional goodies, and Japanese snacks.

→ **1:00pm** – Next, we'll make a stop at **Tokyo Solamachi**. Located at the base of Japan's tallest structure, Tokyo Sky Tree, this large shopping, dining, and entertainment complex features over 300 establishments.

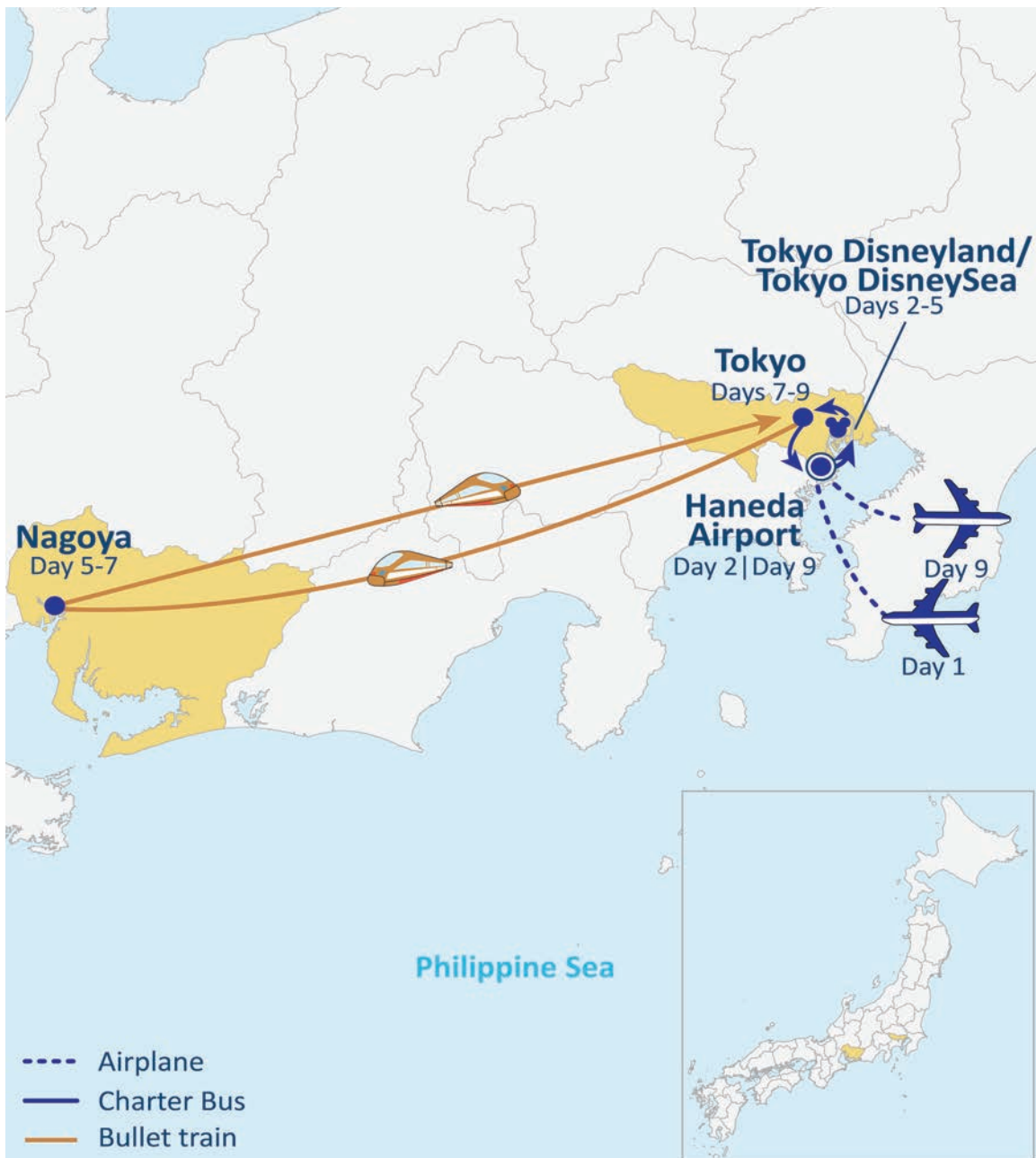
→ **3:00pm** – Enjoy your last minute shopping at **Ueno & Ameyoko Shopping Street**. This is the absolutely perfect place to get your omiyage. "Ameyoko" is short for "Ameya

Yokocho" or "candy shop back alley" since candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, it is short for "America," a callback to the post-WWII era when American products were sold there illegally. Now, the street is lined with cooked street food, snacks like dried squid, and fresh seafood to clothes, bags, accessories, cosmetics, and much more!

→ **Transfer to Haneda Airport to begin our check-in process for our flight home.**

→ **Arrive in Honolulu (same day).**
