Day 1: (Tue) Oct 21 - Honolulu

- → Depart Honolulu via Japan Airlines 73
- → Meet the Panda Travel representative at the airline's check-in counters 3 hours prior to departure.

Day 2: (Wed) Oct 22 – Haneda-OKA(Naha Airport)-Naha (D)

Hotel Collective (Free Wi-Fi)

- → 3:55pm Arrive at Haneda Airport. Meet your English speaking assistant at the arrival lobby. We'll shuttle to Terminal 1 for our OKA (Naha Airport) flight.
- → A bento box will be provided at the departure gate of the flight.
- → 8:25pm Depart Haneda to Naha Airport (OKA) via Japan Airlines 925.
- → Welcome to Naha, the capital of the Okinawa Prefecture. The city is characterized by a blend of modernity and traditional Ryukyuan influences, offering an unrivaled experience with diverse shopping, dining, and cultural attractions. Naha is also a gateway to exploring the scenic beauty and distinctive culture of the Okinawa islands.
- → 10:40pm Upon arrival at Naha, meet your local English speaking guide at the arrival lobby. We'll transfer to Hotel Collective, our accommodations for the next 2 nights and the last 3 nights. Our conveniently located hotel provides easy access to Kokusai Dori, Okinawa's lively shopping district with stalls, boutiques, and eateries.

Day 3: (Thu) Oct 23 – Naha-Southern Okinawa-Naha (B/L)

Hotel Collective (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 10:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour around the southern part of Okinawa.
- → 10:45am This morning, visit to Nanjo's iconic Okinawa World. Visitors are treated to the incredible 3,000 year old natural limestone Gyokusendo Caves; a reconstructed replica of a Ryukyu village with workshops featuring traditional arts and crafts; and a snake themed section dedicated to the infamous local Habu snake. We'll also catch the Super Eisa Show, which features traditional Okinawan Eisa dancing and drumming, and the Habu Snake Show, a small theater snake demonstration. Afterwards, enjoy a buffet lunch.
- → 2:45pm Now, we'll visit Himeyuri no Tou and Himeyuri Peace Museum, prominent and culturally significant Okinawan landmarks honoring the valiant group of high school girls and teachers who were drafted to serve as

nurses during WWII.

→ 4:30pm – Return to hotel. Enjoy the evening of shopping and dining on your own.

Day 4: (Fri) Oct 24 – Naha-Central Okinawa-Onna (B/L/D)

Sheraton Okinawa Sunmarina Resort (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 9:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby. This morning, we'll drive to the central part of Okinawa.
- → 10:00am Today begins with an exciting Water Buffalo Cart Ride at the Hill of the Bios tropical forest park.
- → 12:00pm Enjoy your Japanese-style lunch at a local restaurant.
- → 1:00pm Onto our next adventure: Ryukyu Village, a theme park that transports you back in time to the Ryukyu Kingdom of old Okinawa. Here, let your creativity run wild during a Shisa painting experience. A mix between a dog and a lion, Shisas are Okinawa's guardians. You'll often see a pair of these fanged creatures at the entrances of buildings and stores dutifully warding off evil spirits.
- → 3:30pm Arrive at Sheraton Okinawa Sunmarina

 Resort, our accommodations for the next 3 nights. Enjoy the hotel's buffet dinner at 6:00pm.

Day 5: (Sat) Oct 25 – Onna-Northern Okinawa--Onna (B/L/D)

Sheraton Okinawa Sunmarina Resort (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby. This morning, we'll visit the northern part of Okinawa.
- → 9:45am Now a visit to what has been widely considered the biggest and best aquarium in the world: Okinawa Churaumi Aquarium. Initially built for the Okinawa International Ocean Expo in 1975, the aquarium features an impressive 740 species of sea creatures and tanks so large that even enormous whale sharks can be seen on full display. The aquarium is also a pioneer in developing successful marine life breeding programs and has achieved several scientific feats, including the facilitation of an artificial birth of a luminescent deep-sea shark!
- → 12:30pm Soak in breathtaking panoramic views at Kouri Ocean Tower. Here you'll find the Kouri Island Museum, indoor observation areas, a rooftop deck, and subtropical gardens.
- \rightarrow 1:15pm Time for a Japanese-style lunch at a local restaurant.

- → 3:00pm This afternoon, we'll make a trip to Nago-based Helios Awamori Distillery, a facility that utilizes the high-quality water and natural resources of northern Okinawa to manufacture distinctive products.
- → 5:00pm Return to hotel, followed by a shabu-shabu dinner at 6:00pm.

Day 6: (Sun) Oct 26 - Onna (B/L/D)

Sheraton Okinawa Sunmarina Resort (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 9:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour in the central part of Okinawa.
- → 9:45am Begin the day with a visit to Busena Marine Park. Aboard a whale-shaped glass bottom boat, we'll have an up close view of aquatic life that many have likened to snorkeling or diving without needing the gear. The park also has an Underwater Observatory, offering 360-degrees of the marine world through 24 windows.
- → 12:00pm Enjoy Japanese-style lunch at a local restaurant.
- → 1:00pm Next, we're off to Okashigoten Onna, a well-known Okinawan specialty confectionery in one of Okinawa's top-tier resort areas, Onna Village. In addition to its famous purple yam tarts, the store offers a wide selection of regional sweets and specialty souvenirs. What a perfect time to shop for omiyage!
- → 1:45pm Here we are at Cape Manza, one of the most popular and scenic attractions in Okinawa.
- → 3:00pm Return to hotel and enjoy some downtime.
- → 5:45pm Meet at the hotel lobby and head out for dinner with a musical performance on the sanshin, a traditional three stringed snakeskin covered instrument with royal roots. In the Ryukyu Kingdom, the sanshin was the primary instrument played in the royal court and its music is now regarded as Okinawan treasure.
- → 8:15pm Return to hotel. Enjoy the rest of the evening at leisure.

Day 7: (Mon) Oct 27 - Onna-Naha (B)

Hotel Collective (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 9:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour before returning to Naha.
- → 10:00am Welcome to Yachimun no Sato ceramics village, a collection of kilns, small houses, shops, and galleries. Yachimun pottery is traditional earthenware unique to Okinawa, specially crafted with "climbing kilns."

See skilled artisans at work and marvel at their incredible creations during your time in this remarkable world of pottery.

- → 11:45am Explore and enjoy lunch on your own at Mihama American Village, an expansive shopping mall and entertainment complex featuring an eclectic mix of Okinawan and post-WWII American sights, shops, and sounds. Proximate to U.S. military bases, this popular site is frequented by military personnel and locals alike.
- → 2:15pm Spend the afternoon at AEON MALL Okinawa Rycom, the largest shopping complex in Okinawa. With over 200 specialty stores, 60 restaurants, a cinema, an aquarium, and entertainment stages, this mall is more akin to a small city. Its 7,700 seat food court is even the largest in the world!
- → 5:00pm Arrive at Hotel Collective. Enjoy the evening of shopping and dining at your leisure.

Day 8: (Tue) Oct 28 – Naha (B/L)

Hotel Collective (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour in Naha.
- → 9:00am This morning we'll visit Shikina-en Royal Gardens, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Constructed as a villa for the Ryukyu Kingdom's royal family in 1799, this intricately designed garden features vibrant seasonal flora, a tranquil pond, and Chinese and Japanese inspired architecture. Historically, this garden holds cultural significance as the main venue for hosting foreign emperors and envoys visiting for diplomatic purposes.
- → 10:30am Here we are at Makishi Local Market, Naha's bustling central marketplace for fresh seafood, meat, produce, and traditional Okinawan delicacies.
- → 1:30pm After lunch at a local restaurant, we'll explore the historic Shuri Castle, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Shuri was the former capital of Okinawa and Shuri Castle served as the kings' royal residence for centuries. Its striking red brick tiled roofs are a distinctive feature among Japanese castles and its facade has become a historical emblem of Okinawa. In the aftermath of a 2019 fire, significant continued efforts have been made to reconstruct the site's many buildings.
- → 3:30pm We'll now channel our inner artist for a coral dyeing experience at Shuri Ryusen. Believed to bring happiness, prosperity, and longevity, coral has played a fundamental role in Okinawan culture. Enjoy this memorable activity with skilled local artisans!
- → 5:00pm Return to hotel. Enjoy your evening at leisure.

Day 9: (Wed) Oct 29 – Naha/Free day at leisure (B) Hotel Collective (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → The day is yours to explore the vibrant city of Okinawa!

Day 10: (Thu) Oct 30 – Naha-OKA-KIX-Honolulu (B)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 11:15am After checking out of your hotel room, meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Naha Airport.
- → 12:00pm Along the way, discover the sensation behind Umibudo or "sea grape," a local delicacy and prized Okinawan seaweed, at Uminchi Sea Side Park. While here, enjoy a fun Sea Grape picking experience.

- → 1:30pm Time to check off some last minute items from your shopping list at iias Okinawa Toyosaki. Explore the mall's diverse selection of hundreds of stores and enjoy lunch on your own at the many available eateries.
- → Transfer to Naha Airport. We'll board Japan Transocean Air (operated by Japan Airlines) from Naha to Kansai International Airport.
- → 8:10pm Depart Kansai via Japan Airlines for Honolulu.
- → Arrive in Honolulu (same day).
