Itinerary

Day 1: (Sat) Oct 4 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative at the airline's check-in counters 3 hours prior to departure.

Day 2: (Sun) Oct 5 – Haneda-Maihama

Grand Nikko Tokyo Bay Maihama (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Arrive at Haneda Airport. Meet your English speaking local guide at the arrival lobby before transferring to the hotel.
- → Welcome to Grand Nikko Tokyo Bay Maihama, the official Tokyo Disney Resort® Hotel! Take advantage of the hotel's direct access to the Disney Resort Line monorail system. The monorail, which loops around the perimeter of the resort, will make several stops, including at the doorsteps of Tokyo Disneyland and DisneySea. If you'd like to explore Ikspiari—a vibrant shopping, dining, and entertainment hub—please let your local guide know and they will assist you.

Day 3: (Mon) Oct 6 – Maihama/Tokyo Disneyland (B)

Grand Nikko Tokyo Bay Maihama (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:15am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for the monorail ride to Tokyo Disneyland.
- → Get ready for an exhilarating day at **Tokyo Disneyland!** Explore the many Tokyo Disneyland exclusive attractions like its glass covered Victorian-style indoor World Bazaar and the Beauty and the Beast mini-land that stretches from Belle's village square to Beast's Castle. Don't miss out on the spectacular PhilharMagic show and new rides like The Happy Ride with Baymax! In between attractions, snack on a chewy Stormtrooper mochi or hot, fresh popcorn featuring flavors like curry, cookie cream, and garlic shrimp. Enjoy making fun memories today!
- → Return to hotel The monorail will transport you back to the hotel when you decide to return and rest up for the next day's Disney adventure.

Day 4: (Tue) Oct 7 – Maihama/Tokyo DisneySea (B) Grand Nikko Tokyo Bay Maihama (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ The day is yours at **Tokyo DisneySea**, the 4th most visited theme park in the world! Excitingly, you'll step foot in the park's newly opened Northern European inspired expansion: Fantasy Springs. With rides, attractions, and foods from the massively popular Frozen, Tangled, and

Peter Pan movies, you'll find Arendelle Castle in Frozen Kingdom, the floating lantern festival in Rapunzel's Forest, a pirate ship in Peter Pan's Neverland, and more! But the fun doesn't end there...drift along the Mediterranean Harbor on a Venetian gondola, descend to the ocean's depths in the 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea submarine, explore caverns of mystery in a subterranean vehicle on the Journey to the Center of the Earth ride, and navigate a watercraft in Aquatopia. Fuel up with a gyoza dog, a tiramisu ice cream sandwich, or a tempura assortment plate. Have fun - Sea you later!

Day 5: (Wed) Oct 8 – Maihama-Mt. Fuji (B/L/D) Hotel Mystays Fuji Onsen Resort (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a drive to Mt. Fuji.
- → 11:00am Situated 7500 ft above sea level, Mt. Fuji's 5th station is the starting base for hikers and the most popular stop for visitors to soak in gorgeous views and shop for food, drinks, and specialty goods like handheld canned oxygen bottles.
- → 12:15pm Lunch will be served at a local restaurant.
- → 1:45pm Are you ready to join us on the ascent to Mt. Fuji via the Mt. Fuji Panoramic Ropeway? This cable car ride will take us to see breathtaking panoramic views of Mt. Fuji and Lake Kawaguchiko. Once there, try to spot the Bell of Tenjo. It's been said that this statue grants wishes to those who ring the bell while looking at Mt. Fuji through its heart shaped silver frame.
- → 3:00pm Here we are at Fuji-Q Highland, a popular amusement park located at the base of Mount Fuji. Since its opening in 1968, it has become famous for its thrilling roller coasters, including the iconic Fujiyama, which was once the tallest in the world. The park offers a diverse range of attractions, from haunted houses to family-friendly rides, all set against the breathtaking backdrop of Mount Fuji. (Please note that ride tickets are not included.)
- → 5:45pm Arrive at Hotel Mystays Fuji Onsen, a resort hotel featuring a panoramic view of Mt. Fuji. Enjoy a buffet dinner at 6:15pm, then relax in the incredible onsen, soothing away all your stress while gazing out on Mt. Fuji.

Day 6: (Thu) Oct 9 – Mt. Fuji-Hakone-Tokyo (B/L) Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a

drive to Hakone, an important Edo period checkpoint that has evolved into a popular onsen town today.

- → 10:00am Begin the day with the ropeway ride that takes us to Owakudani, a volcanic valley that resulted from Mount Hakone's last eruption 3,000 years ago. Undoubtedly one of Hakone's most famous landmarks, this site allows visitors to safely explore active sulfur vents, hot springs, and hot rivers while surrounded by gorgeous views of nature. Tip: try the on-site "black eggs," believed to extend your life by 7 years when you eat them! The eggs are hard boiled in the area's geothermal springs and its shells blackened from the sulfur.
- → 10:30am Next, a ride on the famous Hakone Ropeway. Recognized by the Guinness Book of World Records as the "busiest aerial lift" with over 2 million annual passengers, this Hakone must-do offers stunning, sweeping views of the natural landscape below, the steaming hot springs of Owakudani, Lake Ashi, and Mt. Fuji on a clear day.
- → 11:25am Step aboard a leisurely sightseeing pirate boat cruise on Lake Ashi, a caldera lake created from Mount Hakone's last eruption thousands of years ago. Enjoy the splendid, uninterrupted views of the surrounding natural landscapes and on a clear day, spot Mt. Fuji!
- → 12:00pm Enjoy a Japanese-style lunch at a local restaurant.
- → 1:30pm This afternoon, unlock the secrets of Yosegi marquetry at the Hatajuku Yosegi Kaikan and discover the cultural heritage of Hakone. Yosegi is an intricate woodworking technique that arranges thin wood veneers into mesmerizing patterns, showcased through engaging exhibits at the center. Craft your own beautiful yosegi accessory and bring home a one-of-a-kind memento of this tradition.
- → 4:30pm Arrive at Sunshine City Prince Hotel, our accommodations for the next 2 nights. Our hotel is directly connected to Sunshine City shopping center with many shopping and dining options available to you. Nearby, you'll also find a 24-hr Family Mart convenience store and a Seiyu supermarket for snack, bento, and beverage pickups. Enjoy your evening at leisure.

Day 7: (Fri) Oct 10 – Tokyo (B) Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour around Tokyo.
- → 9:00am Today begins at the iconic Tsukiji Outer Market. A renowned bucketlist spot, Tsukiji is the largest fish market in the world. While the inner auction market relocated to Toyosu in 2018, the charm remains in its outer

market. Be sure to enjoy all that the outer market has to offer, from seasonal produce and candy tasting to knife-making artisan shops.

→ 11:30am – Now, a visit to Asakusa's renowned Sensoji Temple and Kaminarimon Gate (aka "Thunder Gate") with its massive lantern. This spot is a "must see" in every guidebook and boasts over 30 million annual visitors. Traditionally, once you reach the top of the temple steps, you should clap twice and bow your head as a sign of respect. With the belief that coins trap the dangers of daily life, visitors also customarily make a small offering by tossing coins into a wooden rack, tossing away those dangers as well.

You'll also find the **Five Storied Pagoda** there. Regarded as one of the "Four Edo Pagodas," this nearly 174 foot monument stands to represent Tokyo's few remaining pagodas. As you roam through the temple grounds, you'll come across the **Nakamise Shopping Arcade**, a lively and extensive shopping street lined with good luck charms, traditional goodies, and Japanese snacks.

→ 2:00pm – From here, visit Ueno & Ameyoko Shopping Street. This is the absolutely perfect place to get your omiyage. "Ameyoko" is short for "Ameya Yokocho" or "candy shop back alley" since candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, it is short for "America," a callback to the post-WWII era when American products were sold there illegally. Now, the street is lined with over 400 shops from cooked street food, snacks like dried squid, and fresh seafood to clothes, bags, accessories, cosmetics, and much more!

→ 4:30pm – Return to hotel. Enjoy the evening of shopping and dining on your own.

Day 8: (Sat) Oct 11 – Tokyo-Kamakura-Haneda-Honolulu (B)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour around Kamakura.
- → 10:00am This morning, a visit to the **Great Buddha** at **Kotokuin Temple.** This mountainous bronze Amida Buddha stands nearly 38 ft tall, making it the 2nd tallest bronze Buddha in Japan. Despite being exposed in the open air since 1495, the statue remains beautifully adorned and well-preserved. For a small donation, visitors can enter the Buddha and experience what many regard as Japan's National Treasure.
- → 11:30am Have fun and grab lunch on your own on Komachi-dori shopping street. Be sure to stop by Kamakura's famous cookie store for a sample. They're best known for their dove- shaped butter cookies, which make

for a great Kamakura souvenir and omiyage gift. Enjoy some last-minute shopping!

- → 2:45pm Our next stop at everyone's favorite,

 CUPNOODLES Museum Yokohama. Here, you'll learn about
 the history and development of instant ramen noodles and
 peer into a replica shed of where it all started. Perhaps
 most thrilling is the hands-on workshop, My CUPNOODLES

 experience, where you become both chef and artist.
- → Transfer to Haneda Airport and begin our check-in process for the flight home.
- → Arrive in Honolulu (same day).
