Itinerary

Day 1: (Sat) Jan 17 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative at the airline's check-in counters 3 hours prior to departure.

Day 2: (Sun) Jan 18 – Haneda-Tokyo Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Arrive at Haneda Airport, and meet your English speaking guide at the arrival lobby. We will then transfer to Sunshine City Prince Hotel, our accommodations for two nights. Our hotel is directly connected to Sunshine City shopping center with many shopping and dining options available to you. Nearby, you'll also find a 24-hr Family Mart convenience store and a Seiyu supermarket for snack, bento, and beverage pickups. Enjoy your evening at leisure.

Day 3: (Mon) Jan 19 – Tokyo-Sumo Tournament (B) Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 8:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby.

→ 9:00am – Our day begins with a visit to **Tsukiji Outer Market**. A renowned bucketlist spot, Tsukiji is the largest fish market in the world. While the inner auction market relocated to Toyosu in 2018, the charm remains in its outer market. Be sure to enjoy all that the outer market has to offer, from seasonal produce and candy tasting to knife-making artisan shops.

→ 11:30am – Here we are at **Arcakit Kinshicho**. This shopping complex not only houses one of the largest Daiso (7/F) in Tokyo but also many stores (e.g. 3Coins on 3/F), fashion retailers, eateries, as well as a supermarket.

→ 1:00pm – Let's join the locals in cheering on your new favorite athletes: **sumo wrestlers**! Japan's national sport and an emblem of Japanese culture, Sumo is a centuries-old wrestling style that began as a performative ritual for Shinto deities. Some of those traditions are still honored, like the symbolic purification of the wrestling ring with salt. Today, sumo tournaments are held six times a year and draw large crowds. Hope you enjoy this exhilarating celebration of athleticism, tradition, and ceremony!

→ 5:30pm – Return to hotel. Enjoy the evening at leisure!

Day 4: (Tue) Jan 20 – Kumagaya/Saitama-Tokyo (B/D) Toki No Yu Onsen Hotel Heritage (Free Wi-Fi) - [Enjoy onsen](#)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ Please leave your suitcase at Sunshine City Prince Hotel and prepare an overnight bag for 1 night in Saitama.

→ 8:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour to Saitama.

→ 10:00am – Our day kicks off with the leisurely **Nagatoro River Boat Ride** where skilled boatmen will steer our traditional Japanese boat along the Arakawa River and through a majestic valley to experience the most mesmerizing views of nature. Enjoy this fun, yet serene cruise!

→ 11:45am – Take some free time to explore and enjoy lunch on your own at **Matsuri no Yu**. Designed after Chichibu's famous festival, this exciting complex features shopping, and food areas. Check out the many eateries offering delectable Chichibu specialties like Waraji Katsudon (crispy pork cutlet rice bowl), Buta Miso Don (miso-marinated pork rice bowl), and miso potato.

→ 1:15pm – From here, a stop at Saitama Prefecture's historic **Bukou Shuzo Sake Brewery**. Housed in a centuries old building registered as a national tangible cultural heritage, Bukou Shuzo has maintained its status as a leading sake producer with its high quality brews that incorporate natural waters drawn from an onsite well. Here, visitors are treated to a behind the scenes look at their sake making process.

→ 2:45pm – If you missed one of Japan's largest festivals last winter, don't fret as the **Chichibu Night Festival Museum** revives this glorious event for you to experience. Festival music, ornate floats, and intricate ornaments come together to recreate the thrill and excitement of this famous event. Happy celebrating!

→ 5:00pm – Arrive at **Toki No Yu Onsen Hotel Heritage**, a tranquil retreat tucked in nature. One of the top hotels in Saitama, this relaxing natural hot spring resort has also hosted members of the Imperial family, including the Emperor and Empress of Japan. And at 6:30pm, enjoy your **Japanese-style dinner**.

Day 5: (Wed) Jan 21 – Kumagaya/Saitama-Kawagoe-Tokyo (B/L) Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ **9:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby this morning for Tokyo.**

→ **10:00am** – Start the day at a must-visit contemporary landmark in Japan: the **Kadokawa Culture Museum** in **Tokorozawa Sakura Town**. Completed in 2020, this architectural marvel pushes the boundaries of physics and design to create a futuristic cultural complex that celebrates Japanese arts and entertainment. A few highlights of this otherworldly museum: the massive “Bookshelf Theater” library containing 30,000 titles; the “Manga & Light Novel Library” with one of the largest manga collections in the world (35,000 manga literature!); the “EJ Anime Museum” and its immersive anime exhibits; the “Musashino Gallery,” a VR and AR playground; and more!

→ **12:15pm – Enjoy a Japanese style lunch at a local restaurant.**

→ **1:15pm** – Here we are at **Koedo Kurari**, a celebrated brewing facility and nationally registered Tangible Cultural Property. The site houses a souvenir shop, a cafe, and a sake tasting room where visitors can sample sake from 30+ breweries strewn across the Saitama prefecture.

→ **2:00pm** – Next, a moment at 1,500 year old **Hikawa Shrine**. Today, many visit the shrine to pray for happiness in the family and luck in matchmaking. Here, visitors can also perform a “hitogata nagashi” purification ritual by releasing a human-shaped paper at the onsite river, make wishes, and improve their luck with “omikuji” or fortune slip readings.

→ **3:00pm** – Now, take a step inside **Kawagoe**, also known as “Little Edo.” Enjoy free time to browse, shop, and explore this former castle town, with its preserved Kurazukuri (clay-walled warehouses) and other historic buildings surrounding. A tip: visit the iconic Starbucks on Kanetsuki Dori Street. Located in an old warehouse, this iconic spot has become world famous and the best example of traditional meets modern.

→ **6:00pm – Arrive at Sunshine City Prince Hotel.** Enjoy the remainder of the evening at leisure.

Day 6: (Thu) Jan 22 – Tokyo/Full day at leisure (B)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **After breakfast, enjoy your free day to explore Tokyo!**

→ If you’ve already experienced Sunshine City shopping mall, take a visit to Ikebukuro station and hop on a rail line that will connect you to other popular areas like Shinagawa, Shibuya, Shinjuku, Ueno, and Akihabara. Ikebukuro station is also close to our hotel.

Day 7: (Fri) Jan 23 – Tokyo-Haneda-Honolulu (B)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **9:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby.**

→ **10:00am** – This morning begins with an excitingly fun **Taiyaki making experience!** This iconic golden fish-shaped pastry dates back hundreds of years to the Edo period, with its first iteration being a round-shaped cake filled with azuki bean paste. During this era, tai (sea bream fish) was highly prized seafood and was gifted to esteemed figures like the shogun. Overtime, tai evolved to become symbols of luck, prosperity, and happiness in Japanese culture.

→ **11:30am** – Next we are at **Asakusa’s iconic Sensoji Temple** and **Kaminarimon Gate** (aka “Thunder Gate”) with its massive lantern. This spot is a “must see” in every guidebook and boasts over 30 million annual visitors. Traditionally, once you reach the top of the temple steps, you should clap twice and bow your head as a sign of respect. With the belief that coins trap the dangers of daily life, visitors also customarily make a small offering by tossing coins into a wooden rack, tossing away those dangers as well.

You’ll also find the **Five Storied Pagoda** there. Regarded as one of the “Four Edo Pagodas,” this nearly 174 foot monument stands to represent Tokyo’s few remaining pagodas. As you roam through the temple grounds, you’ll come across the **Nakamise Shopping Arcade**, a lively and extensive shopping street lined with good luck charms, traditional goodies, and Japanese snacks.

→ **2:00pm** – Now, a visit to **Ueno & Ameyoko Shopping Street**, the absolutely perfect place to get your omiyage. “Ameyoko” is short for “Ameya Yokochō” or “candy shop back alley” since candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, it is short for “America,” a callback to the post-WWII era when American products were sold there illegally. Now, the street is lined with over 400 shops from cooked street food, snacks like dried squid, and fresh seafood to clothes, bags, accessories, cosmetics, and much more!

→ **4:45pm – Transfer to Haneda Airport to begin our check-in process for the flight home.**

→ **Arrive in Honolulu (same day).**
