# Itinerary

## Day 1: (Thu) Feb 12 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu via Hawaiian Airlines

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative at the airline's check-in counters 3 hours prior to departure.

## Day 2: (Fri) Feb 13 – Haneda-Tokyo

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Arrive at Haneda Airport. Meet your guide at the arrival lobby. We will then transfer to **Sunshine City Prince Hotel**. Our hotel is directly connected to Sunshine City shopping center with many shopping and dining options available to you. Nearby, you'll also find a 24-hr Family Mart convenience store and a Seiyu supermarket for snack, bento, and beverage pickups. Enjoy your evening at leisure.

## Day 3: (Sat) Feb 14 – Tokyo (B/L)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

### Happy Valentine's Day!

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 9:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby.

→ 9:30am – Our morning begins with a visit to **Tsukiji Outer Market**. A renowned bucketlist spot, Tsukiji is the largest fish market in the world. While the inner auction market relocated to Toyosu in 2018, the charm remains in its outer market. Be sure to enjoy all that the outer market has to offer, from seasonal produce and candy tasting to knife-making artisan shops.

→ 12:00pm – Time for a culinary adventure at the **Asakusa Sumo Club**. Delight in an authentic chanko- nabe ("sumo stew") Japanese lunch around a genuine sumo ring (assembled with the same materials and standards found in the Ryogoku Kokugikan National Sumo Arena) and enjoy a spectacular sumo show from a former rikishi (professional sumo wrestler) and wrestling students in training. Those who'd like to experience this national sport are invited to wear a sumo costume and test their skills against the former rikishi– what a wonderful and rare opportunity to step into the ring! Participants can also commemorate the experience by taking a photo with the former rikishi.

→ 2:00pm – Afterwards, stroll along the bustling shopping streets in the **Asakusa** district. Discover this shopper's paradise, which includes stalls selling local snacks, restaurants, shopping centers, and a colossal 24 hour seven-story Don Quijote.

→ 4:00pm – Get ready to explore the lively array of food and snack vendors lining **Sugamo Jizo Shopping Street** on this **special festival day**. These festive occasions, occurring

exclusively on days ending in a "4," adding to the excitement of our visit. Affectionately called "Grandma's Harajuku," this half-mile arcade boasts over 200 shops specializing in goods seniors will love. From brand-name products to comfortable shoes and clothes at Takeshita-like bargain prices, you'll find it all here. The most notable item is aka-pantsu (red underwear), believed to improve health, ward off evil spirits, and bring happiness.

→ 5:30pm – Return to hotel. Enjoy the evening of shopping and dining on your own.

## Day 4: (Sun) Feb 15 – Tokyo (B)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ After breakfast, enjoy your free day to explore Tokyo!

→ If you've already experienced Sunshine City shopping mall, take a visit to Ikebukuro station and hop on a rail line that will connect you to other popular areas like Shinagawa, Shibuya, Shinjuku, Ueno, and Akihabara. Ikebukuro station is also close to our hotel.

## Day 5: (Mon) Feb 16 – Tokyo-Chiba-Yokohama (B)

### Happy Presidents' Day!

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 9:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby.

→ 9:30am – Let's kick off the celebration of the annual **Bunkyo Plum Festival** at **Yushima Tenjin**, a popular spot for blossom-viewing since the Edo period. For the Japanese, plum blossoms symbolize vitality, hope, and renewal. Enjoy free time to walk along the beauty of the flowers and view its gorgeous bloom.

→ 11:15am – Our next visit: **Aeon Mall Makuhari Shin-Toshin/Costco**, one of the largest Aeon Malls in Japan! The complex is so enormous, it's divided into 4 malls: the Active Mall (sports focused shops + a sports theme park), the Family Mall (family focused shops + play area and toy stores for children), Pet Mall (essentials for our fur babies!), and the Grand Mall (main hall with everything you need including a supermarket, fashion store, and cinema!). Within the sub-malls, you'll find two Daiso stores, a 300 yen shop, and so much more!

→ 3:00pm – Featuring an array of exhibits that provide a glimpse into the locals' daily lives and cherished traditions, the **Urayasu City Folk Museum** showcases the rich tapestry of Urayasu City's past and present and stands as a beacon of cultural heritage and community pride.

→ 5:00pm – Arrive at JR East Hotel Mets Premier Yokohama

**Sakuragicho.** Our hotel is located just a short walk from JR Sakuragicho Station, providing easy access to shopping areas and an array of nearby restaurants.

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## **Day 6: (Tue) Feb 17 –**

### **Yokohama-Yokosuka-Kamakura-Yokohama (B)**

## **Happy Chinese New Year!**

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **8:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby.** Our morning begins with a drive to Yokosuka, a city known for its picturesque coastal views.

→ **9:30am –** Here we are at **Nagai Uminote Park**, host of the famous **Nanohana Flower Festival** that runs from late December to early April. Among the Park's attractions is **Soleil Hill**, a must-visit spot during this time of year to view fields of flora in its full vibrant yellow bloom. As an exciting addition, we'll also **make personalized pressed flower keychains**, a timeless keepsake that captures the essence of the festival.

→ **11:45am –** Next, a visit to the **Great Buddha at Kotokuin Temple**. This mountainous bronze Amida Buddha stands nearly 38 feet tall, making it the 2nd tallest bronze Buddha in Japan. Despite being exposed in the open air since 1495, the statue remains beautifully adorned and well-preserved. For a small donation, visitors can enter the Buddha and experience what many regard as Japan's National Treasure.

→ **1:15pm –** Explore and enjoy lunch on your own along the **Komachi-dori shopping street**. Be sure to stop by Kamakura's famous cookie store for a sample. They're best known for their dove-shaped butter cookies, which make for a great Kamakura souvenir and omiyage gift. Enjoy some last-minute shopping!

→ **3:30pm –** Usher in the **Year of the Horse** at **Yokohama Chinatown**, where the excitement of **Chinese New Year** fills the air! Join in the fun as you watch thrilling lion dances, savor mouthwatering Chinese dishes from local vendors, and participate in the exciting activities.

→ **6:00pm –** Return to hotel. Enjoy the evening of shopping and dining on your own.

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## **Day 7: (Wed) Feb 18 –**

### **Yokohama-Haneda-Honolulu (B)**

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **9:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Yokohama & Haneda.**

→ **10:00am –** Our morning begins at the **JICA Yokohama Japanese Overseas Migration Museum**. Dedicated to late 19th and early 20th century Japanese emigrants, the museum highlights the contributions they've made to places around the world-including Hawai'i!

→ **11:15am –** Then, on to **Yokohama Red Brick Warehouse**, a historic shipping hub repurposed into a popular and energetic community entertainment center. Here we'll visit the **Yokohama Strawberry Festival**. Have fun shopping and snacking at various stalls while surrounded by the sweet aroma of strawberries.

→ **1:00pm –** Calling all ramen lovers! Get ready to explore the world's first ramen themed amusement park: **Shin-Yokohama Ramen Museum**. You'll find a replica of 1950s Tokyo with retro ramen shops here, each featuring ramen specialties from a different region in Japan. You'll also come across exciting displays showcasing the history of this famous noodle dish and its journey to national and international stardom. Enjoy this delicious culinary adventure!

→ **2:45pm –** Check off your omiyage list at **Tressa Yokohama**, a large shopping mall and entertainment complex inspired by Lyon, France. It is also home to the Kanto region's first auto mall, where visitors can view and interact with the latest Toyota cars.

→ **Arrive Haneda Airport to begin our check-in process for the flight home.**

→ **Arrive in Honolulu (same day).**
