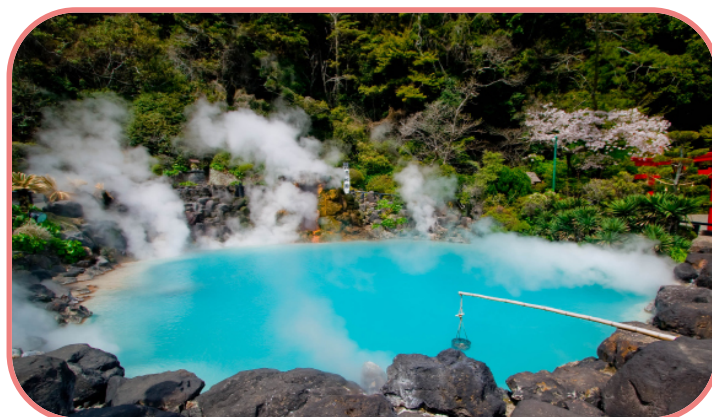

# Itinerary

## Day 1: (Sun) March 29 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative 3 hours prior to departure at the airline's check-in counters.

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## Day 2: (Mon) March 30 – Fukuoka-Hakata Oriental Hotel Fukuoka Hakata Station (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Arrive at Fukuoka Airport.

→ Meet your guide at the arrival lobby. Transfer to **Hotel Oriental Hotel Fukuoka Hakata Station** — Our hotel is centrally located and adjacent to the JR Hakata Station which offers over 100s of stores, including major department stores like Hankyu and HANDS (rebranded from Tokyu Hands.) Nearby, you can also find Kitte shopping mall and a large Daiso. There are also many restaurant options close by. We'll be staying here for the next 2 nights.

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## Day 3: (Tue) March 31 – Hakata-Yanagawa-Hakata (B/L) Oriental Hotel Fukuoka Hakata Station (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 9:00am — Meet your guide at the hotel lobby to get ready for our journey to Yanagawa.

→ 10:30am — Our morning begins with a visit to **Yanagawa**, a traditional castle town built in 1588 that is known for its wide canals. Sit back and relax as we meander through the watery boulevards of the “Venice of Kyushu” on a **donkobune**, a traditional flat river boat steered with a 6.5 ft pole. During this 60 min cruise, our bamboo hatted boatmen will guide us around the many interesting sights of Yanagawa with **cherry blossoms in bloom**.

→ 11:30am — Now, we're at **Yanagawa Tachibana-tei Ohana**, the former residence of the Tachibana family—a clan of feudal lords during the Sengoku and Edo periods. Designated as a national site of natural beauty, its garden boasts hundreds of 300 year old pine trees, 1500 garden stones, and 14 stone lanterns centered around a pond.

→ 12:30pm — Enjoy a Japanese-style lunch at a local restaurant.

→ 3:00pm — After lunch, we'll visit **Maizuru Park**. The park was built around Fukuoka castle ruins and is home to 1,000 cherry trees and other seasonal flora. Admire the natural beauty of this **cherry blossom viewing spot** while strolling along a tunnel of flowers!

→ 5:00pm — Return to hotel. The remainder of the evening is yours at leisure.

## Day 4: (Wed) April 1 – Hakata-Kashima-Nagasaki (B) Hotel New Nagasaki (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 8:30am — Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour to Kashima & Nagasaki.

→ 10:15am — Our morning begins with a visit to **Hizenya Sake Brewery**, located in the famous and historic sake-brewing district of Kashima, Saga Prefecture. Known as the “Brewery of Encounters and Emotions,” Hizenya offers visitors a look into the craftsmanship behind traditional sake production. Don't miss the nostalgic atmosphere of the “Showa Room,” which showcases the charm of the past.

→ 12:00pm — Next, we'll head over to **Michinoeki Kashima**, a roadside station famous for its delicious nori (seaweed) sales. This bustling spot not only offers local produce but also serves as a great place to sample and purchase various regional specialties, including fresh seafood from the Ariake Sea. Take a moment to enjoy the vibrant atmosphere and perhaps pick up some omiyage!

→ 1:00pm — Now, a visit to **Yutoku Inari Shrine**, one of the most famous Inari shrines in Japan. Known for its popularity among those seeking blessings for business and family prosperity, the shrine also attracts visitors in spring for its **beautiful cherry blossoms**. Afterward, stroll along **Monzen Shopping Street**, where you can find various shops and eateries. Enjoy lunch on your own.

→ 4:15pm — This afternoon, we're off to **Glover Garden**, a famous **cherry blossom sightseeing spot** and an open-air museum, exhibiting mansions of former Western residents of Nagasaki. This is where English tradesmen who came to the trading port of Nagasaki settled. During the cherry blossom season, the garden transforms into a captivating spectacle as the cherry trees burst into vibrant hues of pink and white.

→ 5:30pm — Arrive at **Hotel New Nagasaki**. Our hotel is located a short walk from the Nagasaki Station as well as many shopping and dining options. Enjoy your evening at leisure.

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## Day 5: (Thu) April 2 – Nagasaki-Shimabara-Kumamoto-Kirishima (B/L/D) Kirishima Hotel (Free Wi-Fi) - Enjoy Onsen

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 8:00am — Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour to Kirishima.

→ 8:15am — The morning begins with a visit to **Atomic**

**Bomb Hypocenter Monument, Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Museum and Nagasaki Peace Memorial Park.** Constructed in remembrance of the tragic devastation during WWII, this solemn, commemorative space seeks to serve as a reminder to strive for world peace. The surrounding Peace Park features the famed 32 ft tall Peace Statue. With Buddhist influenced themes of love and mercy in mind, Nagasaki native Seibou Kitamura, sculpted the statue with its right hand pointing to the sky from where the atomic bombs fell and its left hand gesturing to its side to represent peace. The park's hundreds of **cherry trees** bring added beauty and calm to this historic space.

→ **11:15am — Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant.**

→ **1:50pm — Now, take a 30 min ferry ride with Kumamoto Ferry from Shimabara Port to Kumamoto Port.**

→ **2:20pm — From here, we'll drive to Kirishima.**

→ **5:00pm — Arrive at Kirishima Hotel**, followed by a **Japanese style dinner at 6:30pm**. The hotel's onsen is a great place to unwind after dinner and in the morning before our departure.

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### **Day 6: (Fri) April 3 – Kirishima-Kagoshima-Kumamoto (B)**

One Station Hotel Kumamoto (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **Please prepare a small overnight bag for 1 night in Kumamoto. Your suitcase will be delivered from Kirishima to Beppu.**

→ **8:30am — Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Kagoshima.**

→ **9:00am —** Our morning begins with a visit to **Kirishima Shrine**. This holy place is central to the ancient mythology of Japan and is dedicated to the deity, Ninigi-no-Mikoto. Legend has it that Ninigi-no-Mikoto descended from heaven, married a princess, and began the lineage of Japanese emperors. He's claimed to be the great-grandfather of Japan's first emperor, Emperor Jimmu.

While volcanic eruptions have repeatedly destroyed this shrine, it has always been rebuilt. The bright red, ornately decorated buildings you see now were built in the early 18th century and are usually decked in **cherry blossoms** around late March.

→ **11:15am —** Then, we'll head to **Senganen Garden and Shoko Assemble Museum**, recognized as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site**. Originally built as a steel factory in 1865, the site became a point of innovation and a center of adoption of western technology.

→ The garden offers visitors a captivating glimpse into Japan's feudal past and the beauty of traditional historic buildings, landscaping, stone pathways, lush greenery, and

varieties of cherry trees. Enjoy the fleeting beauty of **cherry blossoms** during this spring season.

→ **1:15pm —** Next, a visit to **Tenmonkan Shopping Arcade** – a bustling and vibrant shopping street with approximately 1.2 kilometers for locals and tourists, offering a wide variety of shops, boutiques, restaurants, and entertainment venues.

→ **3:45pm —** From here, off to the **Kagoshima Chuo Station** for our **bullet train ride to Kumamoto Station**.

→ **4:41pm —** Once we arrive in Kumamoto, we'll transfer to our hotel, **One Station Hotel Kumamoto**, located in a bustling area with easy access to shopping, dining, and entertainment options.

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### **Day 7: (Sat) April 4 – Kumamoto-Beppu (B/L/D)**

Suginoi Hotel, Sora Tower (Free Wi-Fi) - **Enjoy Onsen**

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **8:45am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby.**

→ **9:00am —** Our morning begins with a visit to the magnificent **Kumamoto Castle**. Its massive castle grounds and impressive hilltop design has been aptly described by Japanese statesman and naval engineer, Katsu Kaishu, as there being “no other castle like this castle.” Although it is currently undergoing a complete restoration, we can marvel at this cultural landmark from the outside and enjoy the majestic scenes with **600 cherry trees** surrounding.

→ Just below the castle hill is **Sakura no Baba**, a bustling feudal era castle town with shops, restaurants, and a museum chronicling the history of Kumamoto.

→ **12:30pm –** Welcome to **Aso Farm Land**, a captivating resort nestled in the breathtaking Aso region. Enjoy a delicious farm-to-table **lunch**, prepared using fresh, locally sourced ingredients from the region.

→ **2:00pm —** Next, a visit to the famous sakura tree at **Isshingyo no Ozakura Park (Aso Sakura Matsuri TBC)**. The Ozakura (“big cherry tree”) was planted in memory of feudal warlord, Nakamura Hokinokami Korefuyu, who perished while valiantly defending Yazaki Castle. At 400 years old, this gargantuan tree towers at approximately 46 ft. in height and has a trunk circumference of 23 ft. The park is also considered to be one of Japan's top spots for **cherry blossom viewing**. Enjoy some free time here to explore.

→ **5:00pm — Arrive at Suginoi Hotel**, followed by **dinner at 6:00pm**. Our hotel features stunning views overlooking Beppu Bay and world-renowned hot springs, which are fed by the region's natural geothermal activity. Spend some time unwinding in the hotel's several indoor and outdoor hot spring baths and soak in the therapeutic benefits of the natural waters.



## Day 8: (Sun) April 5 – Beppu-Hakata (B)

Oriental Hotel Fukuoka Hakata Station (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 8:30am — Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Fukuoka.

→ 9:00am — We begin our day with a visit to the **Beppu Ropeway**, an attraction that takes visitors on a captivating journey up the mountainside, offering panoramic views of Beppu city and the surrounding landscape. Don't miss the opportunity to immerse yourself in the picturesque scenery of **cherry blossom season**!

→ 10:30am — Then, a visit to 2 bubbling and steaming hot springs from a family of 8 Beppu onsens in the **Jigoku Meguri** ("Hell Tour").

Our first onsen sighting is **Umi-Jigoku** or "Sea Hell" for its beautiful cobalt blue. Despite being known as the "Hells of Beppu" for its unapproachable appearance and thermal temperatures of around 100 degrees, the hot springs are nationally acclaimed as a "place of scenic beauty."

Translated as "Blood Pond Hell," **Chinoike-Jigoku** is the oldest natural "hell pond" in Japan with a distinctive red hue colored by iron oxide.

Be sure to try the on site **onsen eggs** (boiled in the hot spring!) and "Jigoku Mushi-yaki Pudding" (**Pudding steamed in Hell**).

→ We'll now drive to **Yufuin**, a picturesque onsen town.

→ 1:00pm — Here we are in the enchanting **Yufuin district**. In addition to its well-preserved ryokans and onsens, Yufuin features charming streets lined with cafes, art galleries, and boutiques. The stunning mountain views also make it an ideal spot for leisurely strolls and relaxation.

→ 5:00pm — Arrive at **Oriental Hotel Fukuoka Hakata Station**. The remainder of the evening is yours at leisure.

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## Day 9: (Mon) April 6 – Hakata-Fukuoka-Honolulu (B)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 11:00am — Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Fukuoka Airport.

→ 12:00pm — Our day begins with a stop at **Dazaifu Tenmangu Shrine**, one of Fukuoka's most popular destinations, attracting over 2 million visitors during the first three days of the New Year. Dedicated to famed prodigy in politics, literature, and poetry, Sugawara no Michizane, this shrine honors him as the god of academic achievements. It is a particularly sacred place for Japanese youths who come from all over the country to pray for success during exam season.

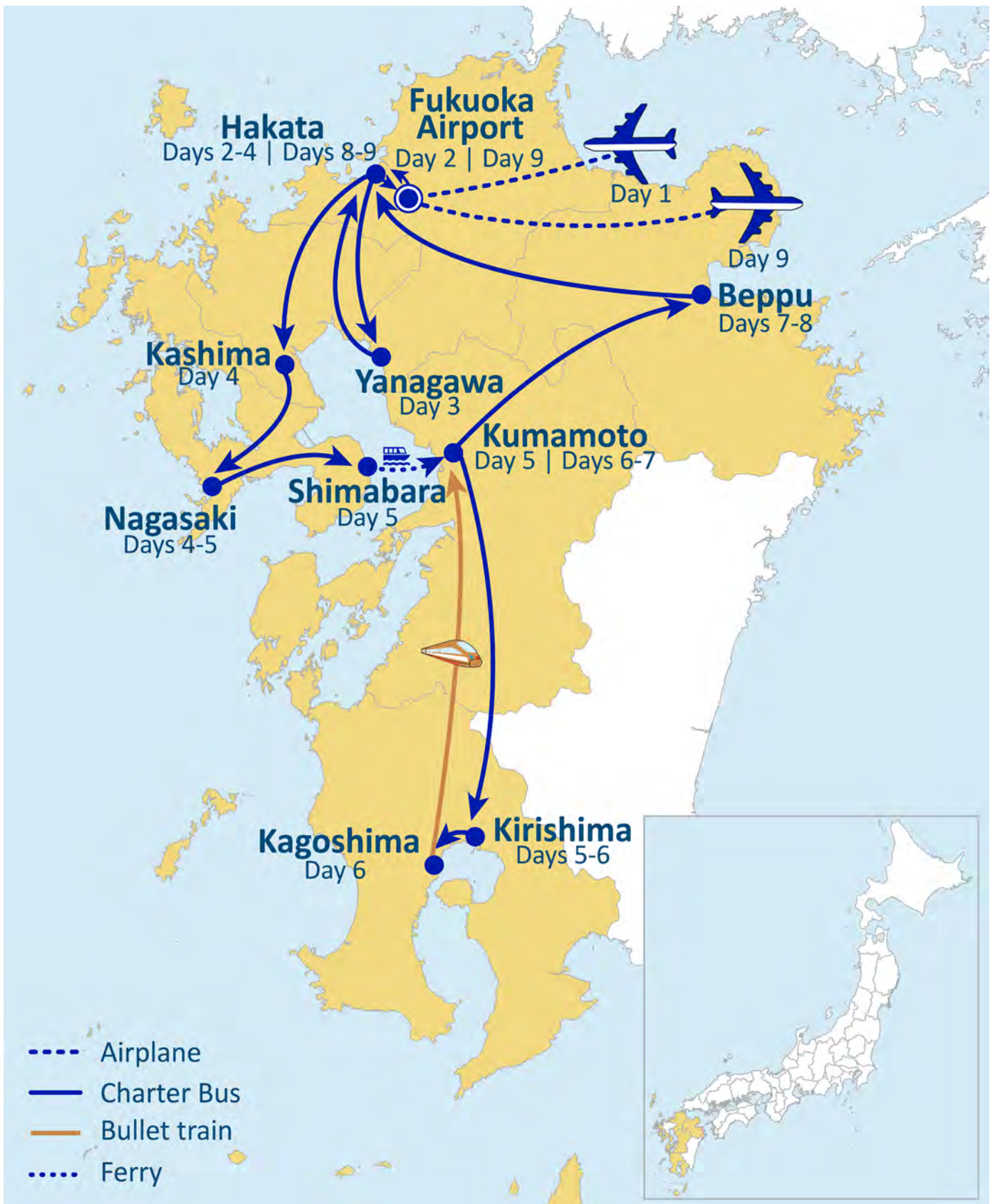
Along the main street leading to Dazaifu Tenmangu Shrine, known as **Tenjin-sama Street**, you'll find a diverse array of shops, including traditional Japanese souvenirs, local delicacies, and modern boutiques. Enjoy this special **cherry blossom viewing** season!

→ 2:30pm — On the way to the airport, we'll stop by a hot spot in Fukuoka: **Mitsui Shopping Park LaLaport Fukuoka**, a large shopping complex that houses over hundreds of shops. Enjoy some last minute shopping at this popular destination for locals and visitors.

→ Transfer to Fukuoka Airport for our flight home.

→ Arrive in Honolulu (same day).
