#### Day 1: (Thu) Apr 16 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative 3 hours prior to departure at the airline's check-in counters.

#### Day 2: (Fri) Apr 17 - Haneda-Tokyo

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Arrive at Haneda Airport, and meet your English speaking guide at the arrival lobby. We will then transfer to Sunshine City Prince Hotel. Our hotel is directly connected to Sunshine City shopping center with many shopping and dining options available to you. Nearby, you'll also find a 24-hr Family Mart convenience store and a Seiyu supermarket for snack, bento, and beverage pickups. Enjoy your evening at leisure.

#### Day 3: (Sat) Apr 18 – Tokyo (B)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour in Tokyo.
- → 9:00am Our day begins with a visit to **Tsukiji Outer Market.** A renowned bucketlist spot, Tsukiji is the largest fish market in the world. While the inner auction market relocated to Toyosu in 2018, the charm remains in its outer market. Be sure to enjoy all that the outer market has to offer, from seasonal produce and candy tasting to knifemaking artisan shops.
- → 11:30am Here we are at Asakusa's iconic Sensoji Temple and Kaminarimon Gate (aka "Thunder Gate") with its massive lantern. This spot is a "must see" in every guidebook and boasts over 30 million annual visitors. Traditionally, once you reach the top of the temple steps, you should clap twice and bow your head as a sign of respect. With the belief that coins trap the dangers of daily life, visitors also customarily make a small offering by tossing coins into a wooden rack, tossing away those dangers as well.

You'll also find the **Five Storied Pagoda** there. Regarded as one of the "Four Edo Pagodas," this nearly 174 foot monument stands to represent Tokyo's few remaining pagodas. As you roam through the temple grounds, you'll come across the **Nakamise Shopping Arcade**, a lively and extensive shopping street lined with good luck charms, traditional goodies, and Japanese snacks.

→ 1:30pm – Explore the enchanting Peony Festival at Ueno Toshogu Shrine, which takes place mid-April until the end of Golden Week in early May. Organized in a maze-like formation, these carefully tended flowers thrive under the protection of dozens of paper umbrellas. To the Japanese,

peonies symbolize bravery and honor and are commonly seen in wedding decor for good fortune.

- → 2:45pm Now, a visit to Ueno & Ameyoko Shopping Street. This is the absolutely perfect place to get your omiyage. "Ameyoko" is short for "Ameya Yokocho" or "candy shop back alley" since candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, it is short for "America," a callback to the post-WWII era when American products were sold there illegally. Now, the street is lined with over 400 shops from cooked street food, snacks like dried squid, and fresh seafood to clothes, bags, accessories, cosmetics, and much more!
- → 5:00pm Return to hotel. Enjoy the evening of shopping and dining on your own.

#### Day 4: (Sun) Apr 19 – Tokyo-Saitama-Tokyo (B)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby as we embark on a full-day tour for Saitama.
- → 10:30am Nestled in the Chichibu Mountains, Chichibu Hitsujiyama Park Shibazakura Hill is known for its stunning pink moss phlox blankets Shibazakura Hill in shades of pink and purple during springtime. Unlike the classic sakura cherry blossoms that sway above, shibazakura blossoms from the ground, creating a colorful carpet beneath your feet. The flower petals resemble sakura's shape and may even have a striped pattern. The display of 400,000 shibazakura, representing 9 unique species, comes together to sit against the majestic backdrop of Mt. Buko, creating a picturesque scene of natural beauty.
- → 12:00pm Now, a fun strawberry fruit-picking experience at Chichibu Fruit Farm, famous in Saitama Prefecture.
- → 1:00pm Take some free time to explore and enjoy lunch on your own at Matsuri no Yu. Designed after Chichibu's famous festival, this exciting complex features shopping, and food areas. Check out the many eateries offering delectable Chichibu specialties like Waraji Katsudon (crispy pork cutlet rice bowl), Buta Miso Don (miso-marinated pork rice bowl), and miso potato.
- → 4:00pm Congrats, you've been enrolled in Soy Sauce School at Kinbue Soy Sauce Park! At this interactive facility operated by a well-known 230 year old soy sauce brewery, "students" (i.e., visitors) will learn all about the soy sauce production process. Be sure to also check out their unique and delectable selection of products.
- → 6:00pm Return to hotel. Enjoy your evening at leisure.

#### Day 5: (Mon) Apr 20 - Tokyo-Mt. Fuji-Tokyo (B/L)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby as we embark on a full-day tour to Mt. Fuji.
- → 10:00am Are you ready to join us on the ascent to Mt. Fuji via the Mt. Fuji Panoramic Ropeway? This cable car ride will take us to see breathtaking panoramic views of Mt. Fuji and Lake Kawaguchiko. Once there, try to spot the Bell of Tenjo. It's been said that this statue grants wishes to those who ring the bell while looking at Mt. Fuji through its heart shaped silver frame.
- → 11:30am From here, a stop at the Kawaguchi-Ko Music Forest theme park and museum. With stunning Mt. Fuji prominently displayed in the background, this musical theme park aptly achieves its intended "European Alps" design. The inside of the museum houses a collection of automatic and antique musical instruments and a concert hall where classical musicians from around the world come to play. The park also features a scenic walking path, a winding canal, a rose garden, a chapel, a restaurant, and some shops. As a highlight of your visit, indulge in a handson music box making experience, where you'll craft your own musical masterpiece.
- → 1:00pm Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant.
- → 2:45pm Next, we'll visit Oshino Hakkai, a village in the Fuji Five Lake region and home to the famous 8 ponds, which are all fed by the snow melt from the slopes of Mt. Fuji. Here, you can drink the clear, fresh snow water trickling down the mountains and filtering through porous layers of lava. The area also has a variety of shops, restaurants, and vendors selling crafts, sweets, and local products. Enjoy a freshly roasted sweet potato or toasted senbei (rice cracker) at this traditional Japanese village with Mt. Fuji in the background.
- → 6:00pm Return to hotel. Enjoy the evening at leisure.

Day 6: (Tue) Apr 21 – Tokyo-Ashikaga-Hanyu-Tokyo (B/L)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:15am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby as we are off for Ashikaga & Hanyu.
- → 9:00am Our first visit this morning is the Bonsai Art Museum. Opened in 2010, this museum is the world's first publicly run museum dedicated to bonsai art. It boasts a splendid collection of over 120 bonsai masterpieces and works inspired by bonsai culture.
- → 11:30am Here we are at the Ashikaga Flower Park,

one of the best places to view wisteria ("fuji"), a beloved Japanese floral treasure. Most notably, the park features an enormous 100 year old fuji tree umbrella with branches of blue fuji flowers gracefully descending from above.

Another attraction is a 263 foot fully formed tunnel of white fuji flowers and a short tunnel of yellow kingusari still in its infancy. The pale red and great wisteria are also usually in full bloom during this time. In addition to the fuji, you'll find many other flowers, restaurants, and a shop selling local products.

# → 12:30pm - Bento box lunch will be provided at Ashikaga Flower Park.

- → 2:15pm Next, a visit to the Onihei Edo-dokoro Parking Area, a unique and popular rest spot that was once a mini theme park. Travel back in time to the traditional Japanese townscapes of the Edo period. If you're a fan of the popular TV drama, "Onihei Hankacho," you'll recognize this location as Heizo Hasegawa's home. You'll find eccentric souvenirs, with many related to the TV drama as well as other goods like wagashi Japanese sweets, pickles, tabi socks, and tenugui hand towels with traditional Japanese patterns.
- → 3:30pm Now, enjoy a hands-on indigo dyeing experience in the city of Hanyu, located in Saitama Prefecture.
- → 5:45pm Return to hotel. The remainder of the evening is yours at leisure.

Day 7: (Wed) Apr 22 – Tokyo-Free day at leisure (B) Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

#### → After breakfast, enjoy your free day to explore Tokyo!

→ If you've already experienced Sunshine City shopping mall, take a visit to Ikebukuro station and hop on a rail line that will connect you to other popular areas like Shinagawa, Shibuya, Shinjuku, Ueno, and Akihabara. Ikebukuro station is also close to our hotel.

#### Day 8: (Thu) Apr 23 – Tokyo-Haneda-Honolulu (B)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 9:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby.
- → 10:00am Our morning begins with a visit to Nezu Shrine, a landmark dating back over 1,900 years ago. When spring rolls around, Nezu Shrine bursts with life, teeming with a remarkable crop of 3,000 blooming azaleas alongside a hilly landscape and a torii path. In Japanese culture, azaleas symbolize abundance and success, making them a thoughtful gift to confer good wishes onto someone. The annual Bunkyo Azalea Festival is the highlight of the year, attracting visitors from all over to celebrate springtime in Tokyo. Take some free time to explore and enjoy the astonishing scenery.

- → 11:30am Next, a stop at Sugamo Jizo Shopping Street. Affectionately called "Grandma's Harajuku," this half-mile arcade boasts over 200 shops specializing in goods seniors will love. From brand-name products to comfortable shoes and clothes at Takeshita-like bargain prices, you'll find it all here. The most notable item is aka-pantsu (red underwear), believed to improve health, ward off evil spirits, and bring happiness.
- → 2:15pm Located on the artificial island of Odaiba, Divercity Shopping Center is a unique and massive landmark that is one of the best shopping, dining, and entertainment complexes in Tokyo. Don't forget to take a moment to snap a photo in front of the famous Gundam Statue. Towering at nearly 80 feet high, this figure is the only life sized Gundam statue in the world. Enjoy some last minute shopping and sightseeing at this famous site!

- → Transfer to Haneda Airport for our flight home.
- → Arrive in Honolulu on the same day.
