Day 1: (Fri) May 15 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu on Hawaiian Airlines

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative at the airline's check-in counters 3 hours prior to departure.

Day 2: (Sat) May 16 – Haneda-Omiya

Palace Hotel Omiya (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Arrive at Haneda Airport. Meet your English-speaking local guide at the arrival lobby, and we'll transfer to Palace Hotel Omiya, where we'll be staying for the night. Our hotel is located with many shopping and dining options available to you.

Day 3: (Sun) May 17 – Omiya-Kanazawa-Toyama (B) DoubleTree by Hilton Toyama (Free Wi-Fi) - Enjoy onsen

(Note: your luggage will be delivered by chartered truck from Omiya to your hotel in Toyama, arriving on the same day)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby. From here, we'll take a short walk to Omiya Station and board a bullet train (Kagayaki 505) to Kanazawa.
- → 10:46am Once we arrive at Kanazawa Station, we'll start our tour by exploring the stunning **Kenroku-en Garden**, known for its beautiful landscapes and seasonal flowers.
- → 11:30am Created by the Maeda family over centuries and located near Kanazawa Castle, **Kenroku-en** translates to "Garden of the Six Sublimities," representing the six essential qualities in Chinese landscape theory that define a perfect garden: spaciousness-seclusion, artifice-antiquity, and water-panoramas.
- → 1:15pm From here, a visit to the hub of all things:

 Omicho Market, which features a network of covered streets with hundreds of stalls. While seafood and produce take center stage, you'll also find an array of items, including flowers, clothing, kitchen tools.
- → 3:00pm Our next stop is the Gold and Silver Leaf Shop, a landmark with a history of gold leaf production dating back 400 years in Kanazawa. At this specialty store, we'll learn from artisans and participate in a gold pasting workshop. Enjoy this fun hands-on experience!
- → 5:15pm Arrive at DoubleTree by Hilton Toyama, where we'll be staying for the next 2 nights. Our hotel is conveniently located just a short walk from Toyama Station, which features a variety of shopping and dining options, including the Toyama Station City complex. Nearby, you'll find MAROOT, Sogawa Dori Shopping Street, and Kitokito Ichiba Toya Marche shopping facility.

Day 4: (Mon) May 18 – Toyama (B/L) DoubleTree by Hilton Toyama (Free Wi-Fi) - Enjoy onsen

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 9:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Gokayama, a UNESCO World Heritage site known for its traditional gassho-zukuri farmhouses. These unique structures feature steep thatched roofs that resemble the hands of Buddhist monks in prayer, designed to protect from heavy snowfall. Some of these remarkable farmhouses date back over two centuries.
- → 10:30am Enjoy a leisurely stroll through Gokayama and soak in the breathtaking mountain views while exploring the charm of the village.
- → 12:30pm At the Gokayama Washi no Sato, we'll learn about the ancient craft of washi paper making, which has been practiced for centuries in this region. Discover the meticulous process of creating this traditional Japanese paper known for its durability and beauty and try your hand at making your own washi!
- → 1:30pm A Japanese-style lunch will be served at a local restaurant.
- → 3:45pm Uncover the 300 years of history behind the techniques and traditions of Toyama's famous pressedtrout sushi at Masunosushi Museum! Indulge in tastings and learn about the craftsmanship behind this beloved dish, along with a variety of sushi-making techniques.
- → 5:30pm Return to hotel. Spend the evening of shopping and dining at your leisure or unwind in the hotel's onsen.

Day 5: (Tue) May 19 – Toyama-Alpine-Omachi (B/L/D) ANA Holiday Inn Resort Shinano-omachi Kuroyon (Free Wi-Fi)

(Note: please ensure you come prepared with warm clothing, comfortable walking shoes, and sunglasses)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 9:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for the Tateyama Kurobe Alpine Route.
- → 10:00am Arrive and enter Tateyama Station.
- → 10:30am–4:30pm An unforgettable adventure begins on the Tateyama Kurobe Alpine Route, which connects Toyama City to Omachi Town. Also known as the "roof of Japan," the Alpine Route is renowned for its unmatched mountain scenery, diverse seasonal landscapes, and the iconic Yuki-no-Otani snow corridor, an expanse of road flanked by massive snowpacked walls that can tower over 65 ft high. The modes of transportation to make the journey through the mountains include trains, buses, cable cars, a ropeway, and even a trolley bus (the only one of its kind in

Japan!). While on the route, we'll also enjoy a **Japanese-style lunch.**

- → 4:30pm Upon arriving at **Ogisawa Station**, we'll drive to our hotel.
- → 5:00pm Check in at ANA Holiday Inn Resort Shinanoomachi Kuroyon, followed by a buffet dinner at 6:30pm.

Day 6: (Wed) May 20 – Omachi-Matsumoto (B/L) Matsumoto Hotel Kagetsu (Free Wi-Fi) - Enjoy onsen

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 9:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby this morning for Matsumoto.
- → 9:45am Our first stop brings us to Daio Wasabi Farm. A cultivator of approx. 10% of Japan's wasabi crop, this massive farm benefits from the crystal-clear waters of the Northern Alps and houses traditional wooden water wheels that were even featured in Akira Kurosawa's "Dreams" film. While here, stroll through the vast wasabi fields, stop by Daio Shrine, and sample specialities like wasabi beer and ice cream!
- → 11:15am Now a visit to the Japan Ukiyo-e Museum, home to the world's largest private art collection of ukiyo-e (woodblock prints) and other masterpieces that have taken the Sakai family hundreds of years to amass.
- → 1:00pm This afternoon, we'll make a stop at the Ishii Miso Factory. The factory specializes in producing a distinctly delicious and rich miso with its 3 year long cedar barrel fermentation process, a disappearing art that this factory preserves. While here, we'll delight in a Japanese-style lunch with miso incorporated dishes.
- → 2:45pm−Time to explore Matsumoto Castle, a designated National Treasure with spectacular views of the Northern Alps in the background. Nicknamed the "Crow Castle" for its grandiose black wainscoting, this castle stands as one of Japan's original castles and rivals Himeji and Kumamoto in notoriety.
- → 4:30pm Arrive at Matsumoto Hotel Kagetsu, conveniently located a short walk away from Nawate and Nakamachi dori with many shopping and dining options.

Day 7: (Thu) May 21 – Matsumoto-Kofu-Isawa Onsen/Yamanashi (B/L/D)

Hotel Hatta (Free Wi-Fi) - Enjoy onsen

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:45am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Isawa Onsen.
- → 10:15am Tucked in the foothills of Japan's Southern Alps lies Suntory Hakushu Distillery, an incredibly popular attraction and leader in whisky manufacturing. Distinctively,

the distillery draws from the Alps's soft mountain water to craft high-quality, award-winning brews. Its signature product, the "Hakushu 18-year-old" single malt whisky, won a gold award in the 2006 International Spirits Challenge.

- → 12:30pm Enjoy a Japanese-style lunch at a local restaurant in the Shosenkyo area.
- → 1:45pm Discover Yamanashi Prefecture's Shosenkyo Gorge, a strikingly beautiful natural wonder and a designated Heritage site. Renowned as one of Japan's most iconic scenic spots and a source of inspiration for countless historical poets and artists, this breathtaking gorge invites visitors on a captivating journey through majestic waterfalls, towering stone structures, and natural greenery. For stunning views, we'll take the ropeway to a panoramic viewing platform and spot the Southern Japan Alps and Mt. Fuji in the distance.
- → Now, we'll head to **Isawa Onsen**, one of the largest hot spring resorts in the Yamanashi Prefecture with over 100 onsen centric ryokan and Western-style hotels at its peak. Famously, the water that flows through this scenic town contains a high concentration of sodium and calcium ions, an alkaline combo with healing properties.
- → 4:30pm Arrive at Hotel Hatta with a Japanese-style dinner to follow. Among several amenities, Hotel Hatta uniquely offers a "wine bath" with panoramic rooftop views. A blend of natural hot spring water and red wine extract, this non-alcoholic wine bath is known for its healing and rejuvenating properties. The hotel also houses the largest open-air free flow natural onsen in the prefecture and an outdoor thermal water onsen that was even featured on a Yamanashi Prefectural poster!

Day 8: (Fri) May 22 – Isawa Onsen/Yamanashi-Tokyo (B)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:45am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Tokyo.
- → 9:00am Our morning begins with a delightful **cherrypicking experience** at lijima Fruit Farm, a part of Yamanashi Prefecture's "Fruit Kingdom." Enjoy this seasonal activity!
- → 10:00am Next, a visit to the Shingenmochi Factory. The factory tour reveals the 6 sec approach to wrapping mochi, a rate at which they are able to produce 120,000 shingen mochi on a typical day.
- → From here, we'll drive to our next destination: Tsukiji Outer Market, Tokyo.
- → 1:00pm A renowned bucket list spot, Tsukiji is the largest fish market in the world. While the inner auction market relocated to Toyosu in 2018, the charm remains in its outer market. Be sure to enjoy all that the outer market has to offer, from seasonal produce and candy tasting to

knife-making artisan shops.

→ 3:00pm – Now a stop at Ueno & Ameyoko Shopping

Street to continue our hunt for omiyage. "Ameyoko" is short for "Ameya Yokocho" or "candy shop back alley" since candies were traditionally sold there. Alternatively, it is short for "America," a callback to the post-WWII era when American products were sold there illegally. Now, the street is lined with over 400 shops from cooked street food, snacks like dried squid, and fresh seafood to clothes, bags, accessories, cosmetics, and much more!

→ 5:00pm – Arrive at Sunshine City Prince Hotel, our accommodations for the night. Our hotel is directly connected to Sunshine City shopping center with many shopping and dining options available to you. Nearby, you'll also find a 24-hr Family Mart convenience store and a Seiyu supermarket for snack, bento, and beverage pickups. Enjoy the rest of the evening at leisure.

Day 9: (Sat) May 23 - Tokyo-Haneda-Honolulu (B)

(Note: late check out until 4pm)

- → After breakfast, enjoy your free day to explore Tokyo before our flight home this evening.
- → 4:00pm Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for our transfer to Haneda Airport.
- → Arrive in Honolulu (same day).
