Itinerary

Day 1: (Fri) Jun 5 - Honolulu Depart Honolulu via Hawaiian Airlines

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative 3 hrs prior to departure at the airlines check-in counters.

Day 2: (Sat) Jun 6 – Haneda-Maihama

Grand Nikko Tokyo Bay Maihama (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Arrive at Haneda Airport. Meet your English speaking local guide at the arrival lobby before transferring to the hotel.
- → Welcome to **Grand Nikko Tokyo Bay Maihama**, the official Tokyo Disney Resort® Hotel! Take advantage of the hotel's direct access to the Disney Resort Line monorail system. The monorail, which loops around the perimeter of the resort, will make several stops, including at the doorsteps of Tokyo Disneyland and DisneySea.

Day 3: (Sun) Jun 7 – Maihama/Tokyo Disneyland (B)

Grand Nikko Tokyo Bay Maihama (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:15am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for the monorail ride to Tokyo Disneyland.
- → Get ready for an exhilarating day at **Tokyo Disneyland!** Explore the many Tokyo Disneyland exclusive attractions like its glass covered Victorian-style indoor World Bazaar and the Beauty and the Beast mini-land that stretches from Belle's village square to Beast's Castle. Don't miss out on the spectacular PhilharMagic show and rides like The Happy Ride with Baymax! In between attractions, snack on a chewy Stormtrooper mochi or hot, fresh popcorn featuring flavors like curry, cookie cream, and garlic shrimp. Enjoy making fun memories today!
- → Return to hotel The monorail will transport you back to the hotel when you decide to return and rest up for the next day's Disney adventure.

Day 4: (Mon) Jun 8 – Maihama/Tokyo DisneySea (B)

Grand Nikko Tokyo Bay Maihama (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → The day is yours at **Tokyo DisneySea**, the 4th most visited theme park in the world! Excitingly, you'll step foot in the park's newly opened Northern European inspired expansion: Fantasy Springs. With rides, attractions, and foods from the massively popular Frozen, Tangled, and Peter Pan movies, you'll find Arendelle Castle in Frozen Kingdom, the floating lantern festival in Rapunzel's Forest, a pirate ship in Peter Pan's Neverland, and more! But the fun doesn't end there... drift along the Mediterranean Harbor on a Venetian gondola,

descend to the ocean's depths in the 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea submarine, explore caverns of mystery in a subterranean vehicle on the Journey to the Center of the Earth ride, and navigate a watercraft in Aquatopia. Fuel up with a gyoza dog, a tiramisu ice cream sandwich, or a tempura assortment plate. Have fun!

Day 5: (Tue) Jun 9 – Maihama-Mt. Fuji (B/L/D)

Hotel Mystays Fuji Onsen Resort (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Please leave your suitcase (2 pcs per person) at the hotel and prepare an overnight bag for 1 day. Your suitcase(s) will be delivered by courier service from Maihama to your hotel in Tokyo the following day.
- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a drive to Mt. Fuji.
- → 10:45am This morning, we'll visit Oshino Hakkai, a village in the Fuji Five Lake region and home to the famous 8 ponds, which are all fed by the snow melt from the slopes of Mt. Fuji. Here, you can drink the clear, fresh snow water trickling down the mountains and filtering through porous layers of lava. The area also has a variety of shops, restaurants, and vendors selling crafts, sweets, and local products. Enjoy a freshly roasted sweet potato or toasted senbei (rice cracker) at this traditional Japanese village with Mt. Fuji in the background.
- → 12:00pm Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant.
- → 1:15pm Next, a fun strawberry fruit-picking experience at Fuji Oshino Berry Land. Unique to this farm is the cultivation of its fruit-nourishment from underground water from Mt. Fuji makes for exceptionally sweet strawberries!
- → 2:30pm We'll now stop by a photo spot of Mt. Fuji and Lake Kawaguchi.
- → 3:30pm Arrive at Hotel Mystays Fuji Onsen Resort, followed by a 6:00pm buffet dinner. Located at the foot of Mt. Fuji, our hotel boasts gorgeous views and is central to World Heritage shrines and lakes. Just a short walk away, you can explore the Fujiyama Museum and Fuji-Q Highland (ride tickets are not included)! Be sure to take time to relax at the onsite onsen during our stay.

Day 6: (Wed) Jun 10 – Mt. Fuji-Hakone-Tokyo (B/L) Hotel Metropolitan Tokyo Ikebukuro (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:30am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a drive to Hakone, an important Edo period checkpoint that has evolved into a popular onsen town today.

- → 10:00am Begin our day with a ropeway ride to Owakudani, a volcanic valley that resulted from Mount Hakone's last eruption 3,000 years ago. Undoubtedly one of Hakone's most famous landmarks, this site allows visitors to safely explore active sulfur vents, hot springs, and hot rivers while surrounded by gorgeous views of nature. Tip: try the on-site "black eggs," believed to extend your life by 7 years when you eat them! The eggs are hard boiled in the area's geothermal springs and its shells blackened from the sulfur.
- → 11:00am Next, a ride on the famous Hakone Ropeway. Recognized by the Guinness Book of World Records as the "busiest aerial lift" with over 2 million annual passengers, this Hakone must-do offers stunning, sweeping views of the natural landscape below, the steaming hot springs of Owakudani, Lake Ashi, and Mt. Fuji on a clear day.
- → 12:00pm Step aboard a leisurely sightseeing pirate boat cruise on Lake Ashi, a caldera lake created from Mount Hakone's last eruption thousands of years ago. Enjoy the splendid, uninterrupted views of the surrounding natural landscapes and on a clear day, spot Mt. Fuji!
- → 12:45pm A Japanese-style lunch will be served at a local restaurant.
- → 2:30pm This afternoon, unlock the secrets of Yosegi marquetry at the Hatajuku Yosegi Kaikan and discover the cultural heritage of Hakone. Yosegi is an intricate woodworking technique that arranges thin wood veneers into mesmerizing patterns, showcased through engaging exhibits at the center. Craft your own beautiful Yosegi coasters and bring home a one-of-a-kind memento of this tradition.
- → 5:30pm Arrive at Hotel Metropolitan Tokyo Ikebukuro. The hotel is conveniently located close to the south end of the Ikebukuro Station, providing easy access to shopping and dining options in the area.

Day 7: (Thu) Jun 11 - Tokyo (B)

Hotel Metropolitan Tokyo Ikebukuro (Free Wi-Fi)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 9:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour in Tokyo.
- → 9:30am This morning begins at the iconic **Tsukiji Outer Market.** A renowned bucket list spot, Tsukiji is the largest fish market in the world. While the inner auction market relocated to Toyosu in 2018, the charm remains in its outer market. Be sure to enjoy all that the outer market has to offer, from seasonal produce and candy tasting to knifemaking artisan shops.
- → 12:00pm This afternoon, a visit to Asakusa's renowned Sensoji Temple and Kaminarimon Gate (aka "Thunder Gate") with its massive lantern. This spot is a "must see" in

every guidebook and boasts over 30 million annual visitors. Traditionally, once you reach the top of the temple steps, you should clap twice and bow your head as a sign of respect. With the belief that coins trap the dangers of daily life, visitors also customarily make a small offering by tossing coins into a wooden rack, tossing away those dangers as well.

You'll also find the **Five Storied Pagoda** there. Regarded as one of the "Four Edo Pagodas," this nearly 174 foot monument stands to represent Tokyo's few remaining pagodas. As you roam through the temple grounds, you'll come across the **Nakamise Shopping Arcade**, a lively and extensive shopping street lined with good luck charms, traditional goodies, and Japanese snacks.

- → 2:15pm Next, we'll make a stop at Tokyo Solamachi. Located at the base of Japan's tallest structure, Tokyo Sky Tree, this large shopping, dining, and entertainment complex features over 300 establishments.
- → 5:00pm Return to hotel. Enjoy the evening of shopping and dining on your own.

Day 8: (Fri) Jun 12 – Tokyo-Full day at leisure (B) Hotel Metropolitan Tokyo Ikebukuro (Free Wi-Fi)

→ After breakfast, enjoy your free day to explore Tokyo!

Day 9: (Sat) Jun 13 – Tokyo-Kamakura-Haneda-Honolulu (B)

- → Breakfast at hotel.
- → 8:00am Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for a full day tour in Kamakura.
- → 9:30am Explore Hase Temple this morning, the go-to destination for hydrangeas in Kamakura. Between early June and early July, 2,5000 hydrangeas of approx. 40 varieties transform the temple's grounds into a picturesque display of blues, pinks, and purples. Enjoy the astonishing scenery.
- → 10:45am Now, a visit to the Great Buddha at Kotokuin Temple. This mountainous bronze Amida Buddha stands nearly 38 ft tall, making it the 2nd tallest bronze Buddha in Japan. Despite being exposed in the open air since 1495, the statue remains beautifully adorned and well-preserved. For a small donation, visitors can enter the Buddha and experience what many regard as Japan's National Treasure.
- → 12:00pm Have fun and grab lunch on your own on Komachi-dori shopping street. Be sure to stop by Kamakura's famous cookie store for a sample. They're best known for their dove- shaped butter cookies, which make for a great Kamakura souvenir and omiyage gift. Enjoy some last-minute shopping!
- → 2:45pm Our next stop at everyone's favorite, CUPNOODLES Museum Yokohama. Here, you'll learn about

the history and development of instant ramen noodles and peer into a replica shed of where it all started. Perhaps most thrilling is the hands-on workshop, **My CUPNOODLES experience**, where you become both chef and artist.

→ Arrive at Haneda Airport and begin our check-in process for the flight home.

→ Arrive in Honolulu (same day).
