Itinerary

Day 1: (Fri) Oct 2 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu via AS849

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative at the airline's check-in counters 3 hours prior to departure.

Day 2: (Sat) Oct 3 – KIX-Kobe (D)

Seaside Hotel Maiko Villa Kobe (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **6:45pm** – Arrive at **Kansai International Airport** and meet your English-speaking local guide at the arrival lobby. We'll transfer to **Seaside Hotel Maiko Villa Kobe**. Our hotel is located on the shores of Maiko Beach with views of the iconic Akashi Kaikyo Bridge, the world's longest suspension bridge. Enjoy a **Japanese bento dinner** served aboard the coach.

Day 3: (Sun) Oct 4 – Kobe-Awaji-Kagawa (B/L)

JR Hotel Clement Takamatsu (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **8:30am** – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for the drive to Shikoku via Awaji Island.

→ **9:45am** – Here we are at the **Uzu no Oka Onaruto Bridge Memorial Museum**, a multifaceted facility built to honor the completion of the Onaruto Bridge. The complex includes: the Whirlpool Science Center; an observation-deck restaurant where you can savor delectable cuisine made with locally sourced Awaji Island ingredients; and a gift shop, offering a variety of Awaji Island souvenirs and other unique goods for purchase. Don't forget to get a photo in front of the life-sized star agricultural product of Awaji: "Otama Onion."

→ **11:30am** – We'll then make a stop at **Michinoeki Donari**, a scenic roadside station in the mountain valleys of Tokushima, perfect for browsing fresh local produce, local crafts, and regional snacks along the drive to Oboke.

→ **1:45pm** – (TBC) Arrive at **Oboke Station** and board the **2:19pm Shikoku Sennen Monogatari** (Limited Express Train) to **Tadotsu Station**. This train is one of Japan's luxury sightseeing trains, winding through dramatic gorges and scenic landscapes in elegant carriages. As you watch the scenery unfold, enjoy a specially prepared **Japanese lunch** during the journey.

→ **5:21pm** – Arrive at **Tadotsu Station** and make our way to Takamatsu.

→ **6:30pm** – Check in at **JR Hotel Clement**. Our hotel is conveniently connected to Takamatsu Station with plenty of shopping and dining options nearby.

Day 4: (Mon) Oct 5 – Kagawa-Dogo (B/L/D)

Hotel Kowakuen Haruka (Free Wi-Fi) - [Enjoy onsen](#)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **8:30am** – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Kagawa and Dogo.

→ **9:00am** – Our morning begins at **Ritsurin Garden**, which was awarded three stars in the Michelin Green Guide Japan! Originally built as a private retreat for feudal lord Matsudaira, this 400-year-old garden is notable for its teahouse, collection of lotus and iris flowers, ponds, streams and historic trees. The forested Mt. Shiun sits behind the park, creating lush, dramatic views with flowers and blossoms blooming throughout the year.

→ **10:30am** – Next, at **Nakano Udon School**, try your hand at making udon noodles using the traditional methods that have made Kagawa Prefecture the undisputed udon capital of Japan. Once our Sanuki udon noodles are ready, they will be cooked and served to you in a flavorful broth for a **Japanese lunch**. Enjoy the rewards of your labor and the authentic taste of freshly made udon.

→ We'll then drive to Dogo via Imabari and stop at the **Imabari Towel Museum ICHIHURO**. Imabari accounts for approx. 60% of Japan's towels, and ICHIHURO brings this tradition to life through weaving exhibits, a showroom stocked with the country's finest towels at factory prices, and more.

→ **3:45pm** – Get ready for the **Tobeyaki Kanko Center Ennosato!** Discover beautiful white porcelain pieces dressed in striking indigo-blue patterns and browse creations from local potters across Tobe.

→ **5:15pm** – Arrive at **Hotel Kowakuen Haruka**, followed by a **Japanese-style dinner at 6:30pm**. This welcoming hot spring hotel is nestled in the heart of Matsuyama's famous Dogo Onsen district, one of Japan's oldest spa towns with a history spanning 3,000 years.

Day 5: (Tue) Oct 6 – Dogo (Ehime) (B/D)

Hotel Kowakuen Haruka (Free Wi-Fi) - [Enjoy onsen](#)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **8:30am** – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Ehime.

→ **10:00am** – This morning, we'll visit **Ozu Castle**, a symbol of Ozu city with a history dating back to the 1300s. The surrounding castle town, the Little Kyoto of Iyo, holds beautifully preserved Edo-period merchant houses that glow with autumn color this time of year.

→ We'll also stroll through **Ozu's historic riverside district** which features the elegant Garyu Sanso samurai villa,

quiet stone-paved lanes, tastefully repurposed historical properties, shops, and more.

→ **12:30pm** – From here, we'll make a stop at scenic **Michinoeki Minatoasis Yawatahama**, a lively roadside station, community hub, and port-side market that offers fresh seafood, regional produce, and the city's beloved jakoten fish cake. Browse the stalls and enjoy lunch on your own from the variety on offer.

→ **1:45pm** – Now step into **Tanimoto Kamaboko**, a legendary Matsuyama institution where artisans have perfected the art of jakoten (golden, crispy fish cakes) across generations. While here, enjoy a **hands-on jakoten making experience!**

→ **4:30pm** – **Return to hotel**, followed by a **buffet dinner at 6:30pm**.

Day 6: (Wed) Oct 7 – Dogo-Kochi (B/D)

Mercure Kochi Tosa Resort & Spa (Free Wi-Fi) - [Enjoy onsen](#)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **8:30am** – **Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Kochi.**

→ **9:00am** – We'll kick off the day at **Hatada Dekitate Okashikan**, the workshop of one of Ehime's most respected traditional confectioners. Join the pastry team in **making chestnut tarts**, a treasured regional specialty, and creating sweet memories while savoring its rich flavors.

→ We'll then take a drive into Kochi Prefecture and make a rest stop along the way.

→ **12:30pm** – Opened in 1985, the **Ino-cho Paper Museum** showcases the 1,000-year-old history of the colorful Tosa washi paper making tradition, which was designated an Intangible Cultural Property by the Japanese government. Roll up your sleeves and get ready for our **hands-on paper making experience**.

→ **2:00pm** – Next, off to **Hirome Market**, an indoor market of 60+ stalls and izakaya. This is the ideal place to try a variety of Kochi specialties and sipping some of Kochi's smooth dry sake. Enjoy lunch on your own while discovering local delicacies like Katsuo no tataki (seared bonito). Catch chefs searing the filets over piles of burning straw and keep an eye out for packs of inaka-sushi (country-style sushi) and crunchy aonori (laver seaweed) tempura.

→ **3:15pm** – Now a visit to the **Yokoyama Memorial Manga Museum**, which celebrates Kochi's own Ryuichi Yokoyama, the pioneering manga artist whose beloved character Fukuchan became one of Japan's most cherished early comic-strip figures and helped lay the groundwork for the country's global manga culture.

→ **5:00pm** – Arrive at **Mercure Kochi Tosa Resort & Spa**, followed by a **buffet dinner at 6:00pm**. During our stay, take some time to enjoy the relaxing onsite onsen.

Day 7: (Thu) Oct 8 – Kochi-Kotohira (B/D)

Kotohira Onsen Onyado Shikishimakan (Free Wi-Fi) - [Enjoy onsen](#)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **8:30am** – **Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Kotohira.**

→ **9:15am** – This morning begins at **Katsurahama Beach**, one of Shikoku's famous scenic spots. Standing boldly above the shoreline is the famous bronze statue of **Sakamoto Ryoma**, a visionary revolutionary most recognized for his success in toppling the Tokugawa regime with peace and without war.

→ **10:45am** – We'll make a rest stop at **Michinoeki Nangoku Furari**, a roadside station with seasonal local produce, local crafts, and regional goods direct from the Kochi countryside.

→ **12:30pm** – Now we'll board the **Oboke Gorge Boat Cruise**, gliding through one of Japan's most spectacular river canyons—you'll see why Oboke Gorge is designated a national place of beauty! Enjoy lunch on your own at the surrounding Oboke area before we reboard the coach.

→ **3:15pm** – This afternoon brings us to **Nishikiya** in Kotohira, one of the region's most respected confectionery houses. Here, you'll **experience Wasanbon sugar making**. Wasanbon is the legendary refined sugar of Shikoku that artisans have crafted for over 200 years, and these sweets grace the finest Japanese tea ceremonies throughout the country.

→ **4:30pm** – Check in at **Kotohira Onsen Onyado Shikishimakan**. Unwind in the natural onsen baths before/after enjoying your **Japanese dinner at the hotel** from **5:30pm-7pm**.

Day 8: (Fri) Oct 9 – Kotohira-Kurashiki-Osaka (B)

Hotel Monterey Grasmere Osaka (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **8:00am** – **Meet your guide at the hotel lobby to journey across the Seto Ohashi Bridge and on to Osaka.**

→ **8:45am** – This morning, a **photo stop** at **Yoshima Parking Area**, where panoramic views sweep across the Seto Ohashi Bridge, a magnificent chain of bridges that spans the Seto Inland Sea above dozens of pine-covered islands linking Shikoku to Honshu in one of the great engineering feats of the 20th century.

→ **10:00am** – At the **Kurashiki Bikan Historical Quarter**, stroll through a beautifully preserved area transformed from former rice storehouses into a vibrant locale with modern eateries, souvenir shops, and museums. Immaculately preserved since the Edo period, this historic rice-merchant district features hundreds of old houses and granaries, the

oldest of which is over 300 years old. Some families have lived here for generations! Today, Kurashiki is characterized by its picturesque scene of whitewashed, black-tiled kura (rice granaries) lining a willow-fringed transport canal. It is a “must-see” traditional neighborhood that beautifully blends the past with the present.

→ We'll then drive to Akashi and visit a rest stop along the way.

→ **1:45pm** – Now a moment at **Eigashima Sake Brewery** in Akashi, one of Japan's oldest active sake producers with origins in the 17th century, to get a behind-the-scenes look at every stage of the brewing process, from polished rice and koji cultures to the cool, fragrant fermentation rooms.

→ **3:15pm** – Then a stop at **Uo no Tana**, Akashi's legendary covered seafood arcade where locals have bought fresh fish for over 400 years. Visitors and chefs across Japan praise this market for the extraordinary quality of its Akashi-brand sea bream and octopus, which fishermen pull daily from the powerful tidal currents of the Akashi Strait.

→ **5:30pm** – Arrive at **Hotel Monterey Grasmere Osaka**. Our hotel is located a short walk to Osaka's most famous entertainment districts. Enjoy the evening at leisure!

Day 9: (Sat) Oct 10 – Osaka-Free Day (B)

Hotel Monterey Grasmere Osaka (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **After breakfast at the hotel, the day is yours to explore the wonderful city of Osaka!**

Day 10: (Sun) Oct 11 – Osaka-Wakayama-KIX (B)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **9:00am** – **Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for KIX.**

→ **10:30am** – We begin our day at Kuroe town's **Uruwashi-Kan**, the traditional Kishu Lacquerware Industry Center, to discover the magic behind one of Japan's finest artisanal and cultural treasures: lacquer. The town is famous for its lacquerware production, and the Uruwashi-Kan hosts the annual Kishu Lacquerware Festival, a popular attraction that draws thousands of visitors. Uruwashi-Kan also houses a museum and specialty shop with beautiful lacquered kitchenware, tools, and more. Excitingly, during our hands-on experience, an expert craftsman will guide us through designing our own lacquered tray with gold and silver powered colors and paints. How fun!

→ **12:00pm** – Welcome to **Wakayama Marina City!**

Designed to resemble Mediterranean coastal towns, this paradise resort island features attractions like an amusement park with European townscapes, a marina, and **Kuroshio Market**—a bustling fish market with the freshest

catches from all across Japan.

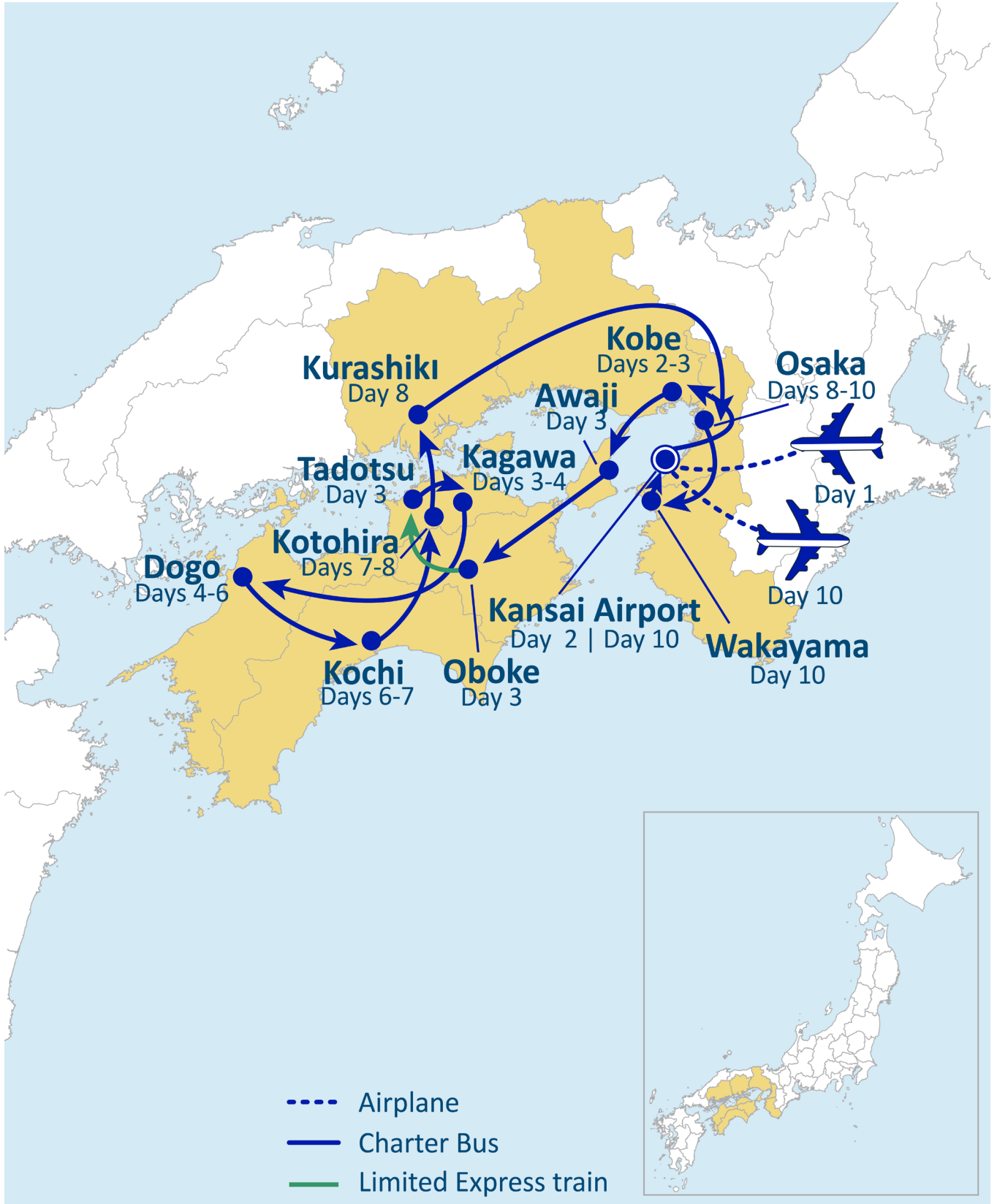
And at **12:30pm**, a must-see highlight of Kuroshio Market: **the Maguro cut show**. Here, a professional fishmonger demonstrates how to expertly filet freshly caught fatty tuna and teaches spectators about the different cuts of fish. Spend some time perusing the many market stalls and savoring the delectable foods and local specialties that can only be found in this market!

→ **2:30pm** – Here we are at **AEON Mall Rinku Sennan**, a large shopping mall with everything you need to round up any last minute shopping before the drive out to Kansai International Airport.

→ **Transfer to Kansai International Airport to begin our check-in process (AS850) for our flight home.**

→ **Arrive in Honolulu (same day).**
