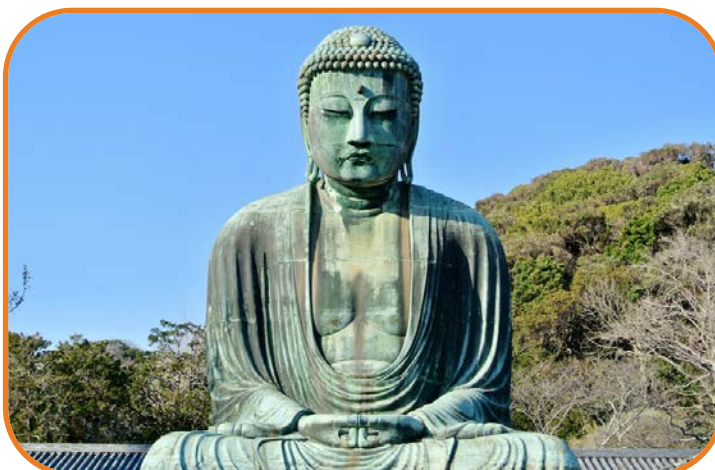

Itinerary

Day 1: (Sun) Mar 14 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative 3 hrs prior to departure at the airline's check-in counters.

Day 2: (Mon) Mar 15 – Haneda-Disney

Grand Nikko Tokyo Bay Maihama (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Arrive at **Haneda Airport** and meet your guide at the arrival lobby. We'll then transfer to **Grand Nikko Tokyo Bay Maihama**. Conveniently located, with monorail access to both Disneyland & DisneySea, this hotel is also 10 mins away from the many shopping and dining options at Ikspiari. We'll be staying at this official Tokyo Disney Resort® Hotel for the next 3 nights.

Day 3: (Tue) Mar 16 – Tokyo Disneyland (B)

Grand Nikko Tokyo Bay Maihama (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 8:15am Meet your guide at hotel lobby for the monorail ride to Tokyo Disneyland.

→ Get ready for an exhilarating day at **Tokyo Disneyland**! Explore the many Tokyo Disneyland exclusive attractions like its glass covered Victorian-style indoor World Bazaar and the Beauty and the Beast mini-land that stretches from Belle's village square to Beast's Castle. Don't miss out on the spectacular PhilharMagic show and new rides like The Happy Ride with Baymax! In between attractions, snack on a chewy Stormtrooper mochi or hot, fresh popcorn featuring flavors like curry, cookie cream, and garlic shrimp. Enjoy making fun memories today!

→ **Return to hotel** – The monorail will transport you back to the hotel when you decide to return and rest up for the next day's Disney adventure.

Day 4: (Wed) Mar 17 – Tokyo DisneySea (B)

Grand Nikko Tokyo Bay Maihama (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ The day is yours at **Tokyo DisneySea**, the 4th most visited theme park in the world! Excitingly, you'll join the ["Sparkling Jubilee" 25th Anniversary celebration](#), running April 15, 2026, through March 31, 2027. Step into the park's massive expansion: Fantasy Springs (opened in June 2024). With rides, attractions, and foods from the popular Frozen, Tangled, and Peter Pan movies, you'll find Arendelle Castle in Frozen Kingdom, the floating lantern festival in Rapunzel's Forest, a

pirate ship in Peter Pan's Neverland, and more! But the fun doesn't end there...drift along the Mediterranean Harbor on a Venetian gondola, descend to the ocean's depths in the 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea submarine, take to the skies on a dream-filled journey aboard Soaring: Fantastic Flight, and set sail with Chandu on Sindbad's Storybook Voyage. Fuel up with gyoza dogs and Jubilee Blue treats. Have fun - Sea you later!

Day 5: (Thu) Mar 18 – Disney-Yokohama (B)

Yokohama Bay Hotel Tokyu (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 8:30am – Meet your guide in the hotel lobby to begin our journey to **Kamakura**. Established by Minamoto no Yoritomo in 1192, this coastal city served as the seat of Japan's first military government. Kamakura remained the political heart of Eastern Japan for over a century. Today, it is affectionately known as the "Kyoto of Eastern Japan," celebrated for its wealth of ancient temples, shrines, and preserved historical monuments.

→ 10:00am – We arrive at the **Great Buddha at Kotokuin Temple**. This monumental bronze statue of Amida Buddha stands over 38 feet tall, making it the second-tallest bronze Buddha in Japan. Despite being exposed in the open air since 1495, the statue remains beautifully adorned and well-preserved. Today, it is recognized as one of Japan's most iconic National Treasures. For a small donation, visitors are welcome to enter inside the Buddha to witness the sophisticated 13th-century casting techniques.

→ 11:30am – Enjoy lunch on your own on **Komachi-dori Shopping Street**. Be sure to stop by Kamakura's famous cookie store for a sample. They're best known for their dove-shaped butter cookies, which make for a great Kamakura souvenir.

→ 2:00pm – Dedicated to the late 19th and early 20th century Japanese emigrants, **JICA Yokohama Japanese Overseas Migration Museum** highlights the contributions they've made to places around the world-including Hawai'i!

→ 3:30pm – Our next visit is to everyone's favorite, the Nissin's **CUPNOODLES Museum**. Here, you will trace the fascinating history of instant ramen and peek into a replica of the simple wooden shed where this global phenomenon began.

The highlight of the visit is the **My CUPNOODLES Factory workshop**, where you become both chef and artist. In this hands-on experience, you will design your own iconic packaging before selecting your favorite soup base and

a custom blend of toppings. By the end, you'll have a completely unique, one-of-a-kind souvenir to take home.

→ **5:00pm** – Our day concludes in Minato Mirai 21, which translates to “Harbor of the Future.” This seaside district is the crown jewel of Yokohama’s modern skyline. Since our stay at the **Yokohama Bay Hotel Tokyu** places us at the center of it all, we are right at the doorstep of:

- Cosmo Clock 21: One of the world’s largest Ferris wheels, which illuminates the night sky with a spectacular light show.
 - Queen’s Square & Landmark Plaza: Massive shopping hubs connected by climate-controlled walkways, offering everything from high-end boutiques to unique local souvenirs.
 - The Waterfront: A beautiful area for an evening stroll to take in the sea breeze and the shimmering lights of the bay.
- Enjoy the rest of the evening at leisure.

**Day 6: (Fri) Mar 19 –
Yokohama-Free day at leisure (B)**
Yokohama Bay Hotel Tokyu (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **After breakfast, enjoy your free day to explore Yokohama!**

Day 7: (Sat) Mar 20 – Yokohama-Tokyo (B/L)
Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **9:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby this morning for Tokyo.**

→ **10:00am** – Reopened in March 2026 after its first major renovation since 1993, the **Edo Tokyo Museum** brings Tokyo’s transformation from feudal Edo to modern megalopolis to life through newly updated and expanded exhibits across 6 immersive floors. Standout additions include a full scale Nihonbashi bridge replica, an expanded Edo streetscape with authentic period market stalls, a walkable interior replica of the traditional Nakamura-Za Theater, and a stunning third floor plaza redesigned by acclaimed architect Shohei Shigematsu.

→ **12:00pm** – Enjoy a **Japanese-style lunch** at a local restaurant.

→ **1:30pm** – Now, we are at Asakusa’s iconic **Sensoji Temple** and **Kaminarimon Gate** (aka “Thunder Gate”) with its massive, unmistakable red lantern. This is a “must see” in every guidebook and welcomes over 30 million visitors annually. At the top of the temple steps, follow local custom: clap twice, bow your head, and toss a coin into the offering rack to cast away life’s daily dangers. As you wander the temple grounds, you’ll pass through the **Nakamise Shopping Arcade**, a lively stretch lined with good luck charms,

traditional sweets, and Japanese snacks.

→ **3:30pm** – Time to dive into the high-energy **Ameyoko Shopping Street**, located in the heart of Ueno. From hidden bargains to street-food delicacies, Ameyoko is a treasure trove for all ages. As we explore, we may also have the opportunity to enjoy early **cherry blossoms** in **Ueno Park**, one of Tokyo’s most iconic spots for seasonal blooms. Whether you are admiring the flowers or hunting for the perfect souvenir, this stop offers the very best of Tokyo’s vibrant local life.

→ **5:30pm** – Arrive at **Sunshine City Prince Hotel**, our stay for the next 2 nights. The hotel lobby offers direct access to Sunshine City, a huge shopping and entertainment complex with 4 towers that include an aquarium, planetarium, solarium, a virtual reality play experience, and a nearly 788 foot high skyscraper with an observation deck. Beyond the famous Pokémon Center Mega Tokyo, the complex also houses Namja Town, a unique food and dessert theme park. For quick essentials, a 24-hour Family Mart and a Seiyu supermarket are located nearby for snack, bento, and beverage pickups. Enjoy the evening at leisure!

Day 8: (Sun) Mar 21 – Tokyo-Free day at leisure (B)
Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **After breakfast, enjoy your free day to explore Tokyo!**

→ If you’ve already experienced the Sunshine City shopping mall, head over to Ikebukuro Station and hop on a rail line that connects you to other popular areas like Shinagawa, Shibuya, Shinjuku, and Akihabara. Ikebukuro Station is very close to our hotel.

Day 9: (Mon) Mar 22 – Tokyo-Haneda-Honolulu (B)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **10:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Tokyo & HND.**

→ **10:30am** – Start your day at the **Tsukiji Outer Market**, a legendary bucket-list spot that continues to serve as the soul of Tokyo’s food scene. While the inner auction market relocated to Toyosu in 2018, the charm remains in its outer market. Be sure to enjoy all that the outer market has to offer, from seasonal produce and local tastings to knife-making artisan shops.

→ **1:00pm** – Next, a visit to a reality-bending magic at **teamLab Planets Tokyo**. Using technology and perspective, this immersive museum takes visitors through labyrinth-like rooms filled with flower fields, interactive play areas where you can catch digital animals, jump on pod blocks, and experience other mesmerizing digital art displays.

→ **3:00pm** – Located on the artificial island of Odaiba, **Divercity Shopping Center** is a unique and massive landmark that is one of the best shopping, dining, and entertainment complexes in Tokyo. Don't forget to take a moment to snap a photo in front of the famous Gundam Statue. Towering at nearly 80 feet high, this figure is the only life sized Gundam statue in the world. Enjoy some last minute shopping and sightseeing at this famous site!

→ **Transfer to Haneda Airport for our flight home.**

→ **Arrive in Honolulu on the same day.**
