Itinerary

Day 1: (Sun) Mar 14 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative at the airline's check-in counters 3 hours prior to departure.

Day 2: (Mon) Mar 15 – Haneda-Tokyo

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Arrive at **Haneda Airport**, and meet your English speaking guide at the arrival lobby. We will then transfer to **Sunshine City Prince Hotel**, our accommodations for 2 nights. Our hotel is directly connected to Sunshine City shopping center with many shopping and dining options available to you. Nearby, you'll also find a 24-hr Family Mart convenience store and a Seiyu supermarket for snack, bento, and beverage pickups. Enjoy your evening at leisure.

Day 3: (Tue) Mar 16 – Tokyo (B)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 8:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Tokyo.

→ 9:00am – Our day begins with a visit to the **Tsukiji Outer Market**. Once the world's largest fish market, Tsukiji's beloved outer market still buzzes with energy, offering fresh street food, seasonal produce tastings, and artisan knife shops that have supplied Tokyo's top chefs for generations. The inner auction relocated to Toyosu in 2018, but this bucket-list destination's flavor and character are very much alive.

→ 11:00am – Reopened in March 2026 after its first major renovation since 1993, the **Edo Tokyo Museum** brings Tokyo's transformation from feudal Edo to modern megalopolis to life through newly updated and expanded exhibits across 6 immersive floors. Standout additions include a full scale Nihonbashi bridge replica, an expanded Edo streetscape with authentic period market stalls, a walkable interior replica of the traditional Nakamura-Za Theater, and a stunning third floor plaza redesigned by acclaimed architect Shohei Shigematsu.

→ 1:00pm – Free time to explore **Asakusa** (lunch on your own) and its iconic **Sensoji Temple** and **Kaminarimon Gate** (aka "Thunder Gate") with its massive red lantern. This spot is a "must see" in every guidebook and boasts over 30 million annual visitors. You'll also find the **Five Storied Pagoda** and the **Nakamise Shopping Arcade**, a lively and extensive shopping street lined with good luck charms, traditional goodies, and Japanese snacks.

→ 3:00pm – Welcome to **Kaminari 5656 Kaikan**, a facility

dedicated to Asakusa's treasured puffed rice confection: Kaminari-okoshi. The word "okoshi" means "to rise" or "to prosper," making these crunchy golden bites of puffed rice, sugar, and peanuts a cherished symbol of good fortune you can sample fresh from the historic storefront! Here, you'll also enjoy a special **kaminari-okoshi making experience** and get a behind the scenes look into the production process of these famous treats on the factory tour.

→ 4:30pm – Return to hotel. Enjoy the rest of the day at leisure.

Day 4: (Wed) Mar 17 – Tokyo-Gunma-Kumagaya/Saitama (B/D)

Toki No Yu Onsen Hotel Heritage (Free Wi-Fi) - [Enjoy onsen](#)

→ Please leave your luggage(s) at Sunshine City Prince Hotel and prepare an overnight bag for an overnight stay at Saitama.

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 8:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for the scenic prefecture of Gunma.

→ 10:15am – Our day begins with a behind-the-scenes look at the award-winning rusk biscuits at **Gateau Festa Harada factory**. Affectionately referred to as a "snack for kings," this elegant treat has become a nationwide phenomenon.

→ 11:30am – Grab lunch on your own at **Michinoeki Laranfujioka**, a roadside rest area that offers a blend of local delicacies, seasonal treats, and food stalls.

→ 1:15pm – Next, dive into Japanese tradition at the **Shorinzan Daruma Temple**. As the birthplace of the well-known Daruma wishing dolls, this temple is filled with color and history. Roll up your sleeves for a hands-on **Daruma painting experience**, painting the eyes and adding your own personal wishes to create a unique souvenir to take home.

→ 2:45pm – Gear up for a quirky and delicious adventure at the **Konnyaku Theme Park!** As the only konnyaku theme park in Japan, this unique destination allows visitors to learn all about this healthy, traditional superfood through fun, interactive exhibits. The highlight of the visit is the high-energy **All-You-Can-Pack Experience**, where you can challenge yourself to stuff as many delicious konnyaku treats into your bag as possible! Fun Fact: Konnyaku is so low in calories and high in fiber that it is known in Japan as a "stomach broom" because it naturally cleanses your digestive system as you eat it!

→ 5:00pm – Arrive at **Toki No Yu Onsen Hotel Heritage**, a tranquil retreat tucked in nature. One of the top hotels in Saitama, this relaxing natural hot spring resort has also hosted members of the Imperial family, including the

Emperor and Empress of Japan. And at 6:30pm, enjoy your Japanese-style dinner.

Day 5: (Thu) Mar 18 – Kumagaya/Saitama-Kawagoe-Tokyo (B/L)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 9:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby this morning for Saitama & Tokyo.

→ 10:00am – Start the day with a visit to **Kinbue Syoyu Park**, home to a traditional soy sauce factory. Take a guided tour to learn about the soy sauce brewing process and the rich history behind it. Enjoy the delightful aroma as you explore the fermentation rooms. After the tour, sample various soy sauce products and perhaps pick up a few unique bottles to take home.

→ 11:30am – Next, a moment at 1,500 year old **Hikawa Shrine**. Today, many visit the shrine to pray for happiness in the family and luck in matchmaking. Here, visitors can also perform a “hitogata nagashi” purification ritual by releasing a human-shaped paper at the onsite river, make wishes, and improve their luck with “omikuji” or fortune slip readings.

→ 12:45pm – A **Japanese-style lunch** will be served at a local restaurant.

→ 1:45pm – Here we are at **Koedo Kurari**, a celebrated brewing facility and nationally registered Tangible Cultural Property. The site houses a souvenir shop, a cafe, and a sake tasting room where visitors can sample sake from 30+ breweries strewn across the Saitama prefecture.

→ 2:30pm – Enjoy free time to browse, shop, and explore **Kawagoe**, also known as “Little Edo.” This former castle town features preserved Kurazukuri (clay-walled warehouses) and other historic buildings. A tip: don’t miss the Starbucks on Kanetsuki Dori Street. Located in an old warehouse, this famous spot perfectly exemplifies the blend of traditional and modern.

→ 4:30pm – Arrive at **Sunshine City Prince Hotel**. Enjoy the remainder of the evening at leisure.

Day 6: (Fri) Mar 19 – Tokyo/Free day (B)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ After breakfast, enjoy your free day to explore Tokyo!

→ If you’ve already experienced Sunshine City shopping mall, head over to Ikebukuro station and hop on a rail line that will connect you to other popular areas like Shinagawa, Shibuya, Shinjuku, and Akihabara. Ikebukuro station is also close to our hotel.

Day 7: (Sat) Mar 20 – Tokyo-NRT-Honolulu (B)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 10:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Tokyo & Narita.

→ 10:30am – This morning, dive into the high-energy **Ameyoko Shopping Street**, located in the heart of Ueno. From hidden bargains to street-food delicacies, Ameyoko is a treasure trove for all ages. As we explore, we may also have the opportunity to enjoy early **cherry blossoms** in **Ueno Park**, one of Tokyo’s most iconic spots for seasonal blooms.

→ We’ll now drive to Narita.

→ 2:00pm – Step back into the Edo period at **Naritasan Shinshoji Temple**, a majestic Buddhist temple founded in 940 AD and devoted to the fierce guardian deity Fudo Myoo. The expansive grounds feature a grand Main Hall, a vermilion Great Pagoda of Peace, and tranquil gardens reflecting over a thousand years of pilgrimage history. To reach the temple, stroll along the charming **Omotesando Street**, a half-mile path lined with shops selling Narita’s famed unagi, rice crackers, and traditional sweets.

→ 3:45pm – Here we’re at **Aeon Mall Narita**, a large shopping mall with everything you need to round up any last minute shopping.

→ Transfer to Narita Airport for our flight home.

→ Arrive in Honolulu on the same day.
