Itinerary

Day 1: (Thu) Feb 11 – Honolulu Depart Honolulu via Hawaiian Airlines

→ Meet the Panda Travel representative at the airline's check-in counters 3 hours prior to departure.

Day 2: (Fri) Feb 12 – Haneda-Tokyo

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Arrive at **Haneda Airport**. Meet your guide at the arrival lobby. We will then transfer to **Sunshine City Prince Hotel**. Our hotel is directly connected to Sunshine City shopping center with many shopping and dining options available to you. Nearby, you'll also find a 24-hr Family Mart convenience store and a Seiyu supermarket for snack, bento, and beverage pickups. Enjoy your evening at leisure.

Day 3: (Sat) Feb 13 – Tokyo (B/L)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 9:00am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Tokyo.

→ 9:45am – Start your day at the **Tsukiji Outer Market**, a legendary bucket-list spot that continues to serve as the soul of Tokyo's food scene. While the inner auction market relocated to Toyosu in 2018, the charm remains in its outer market. Be sure to enjoy all that the outer market has to offer, from seasonal produce and local tastings to knife-making artisan shops.

→ 12:00pm – Time for a culinary adventure at the **Asakusa Sumo Club**. Delight in an authentic **chanko-nabe** ("sumo stew") **Japanese lunch** around a genuine sumo ring (assembled with the same materials and standards found in the Ryogoku Kokugikan National Sumo Arena) and enjoy a spectacular sumo show from a former rikishi (professional sumo wrestler) and wrestling students in training. Those who'd like to experience this national sport are invited to wear a sumo costume and test their skills against the former rikishi— what a wonderful and rare opportunity to step into the ring! Participants can also commemorate the experience by taking a photo with the former rikishi.

→ 2:00pm – Afterwards, stroll along the bustling shopping streets in the **Asakusa** district. Discover this shopper's paradise, which includes stalls selling local snacks, restaurants, shopping centers, and a colossal 24 hour seven-story Don Quijote.

→ 3:15pm – Here, dive into the lively **Ameyoko Shopping**

Street, located in the heart of Ueno. From hidden bargains to street-food delicacies, Ameyoko is a treasure trove for all ages.

→ 5:30pm – **Return to hotel**. Enjoy the evening of shopping and dining on your own.

Day 4: (Sun) Feb 14 – Tokyo (B)

Sunshine City Prince Hotel (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **After breakfast, enjoy your free day to explore Tokyo!**

→ If you've already experienced Sunshine City shopping mall, take a visit to Ikebukuro station and hop on a rail line that will connect you to other popular areas like Shinagawa, Shibuya, Shinjuku, and Akihabara. Ikebukuro station is also close to our hotel.

Day 5: (Mon) Feb 15 – Tokyo-Yokohama (B)

Yokohama Bay Hotel Tokyu (Free Wi-Fi)

→ Breakfast at hotel.

→ 9:00am – Meet your guide in the hotel lobby for Yokohama.

→ 10:00am – Our morning begins at **Sankeien Garden**, a sprawling traditional sanctuary renowned for its historic architecture and seasonal elegance. In mid-February, the garden serves as a premier destination for **plum blossom viewing**. With roughly 600 plum trees blooming in delicate shades of white and pink, the groves offer a poetic atmosphere, the first true glimpse of spring set against a backdrop of ancient pagodas and serene ponds.

→ 11:30am – Next, we'll head into **Yokohama Chinatown**, the largest chinatown in Japan. With over 600 shops and eateries, this culinary labyrinth is the perfect place to explore. You'll have time to enjoy lunch on your own, perhaps hunting down famous steamed pork buns (nikuman), crispy roasted duck, or street-side dim sum.

While there, we'll also visit **Yokohama Daisekai**, an 8 story entertainment complex designed to evoke the spirit of "Old Shanghai." The highlight is the **Artrick Museum**, an interactive space where art comes to life. Using clever forced-perspective techniques and optical illusions, the museum invites you to become part of the paintings. It's a playful experience where you can "float" in the air or "escape" the jaws of a shark, perfect for unique photos.

→ 3:00pm – Our day concludes in Minato Mirai 21, which translates to "Harbor of the Future." This seaside district is

the crown jewel of Yokohama's modern skyline. Since our stay at the **Yokohama Bay Hotel Tokyu** places us at the center of it all, we are right at the doorstep of:

- **Cosmo Clock 21:** One of the world's largest Ferris wheels, which illuminates the night sky with a spectacular light show.
- **Queen's Square & Landmark Plaza:** Massive shopping hubs connected by climate-controlled walkways, offering everything from high-end boutiques to unique local souvenirs.
- **The Waterfront:** A beautiful area for an evening stroll to take in the sea breeze and the shimmering lights of the bay.

Enjoy the rest of the day at leisure.

Day 6: (Tue) Feb 16 – Yokohama-Miura-Kamakura-Yokohama (B)

Yokohama Bay Hotel Tokyu (Free Wi-Fi)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **8:30am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby.** Our morning begins with a drive to the Miura Peninsula, a coastal region known for its fresh seafood and seasonal landscapes.

→ **9:30am –** Here we are at the famous **Miura Kaigan Cherry Blossom Festival** for its early-blooming Kawazu-zakura trees. Unlike the typical pale blossoms seen later in spring, these bloom from early February to late March and are known for their rich, vibrant pink. As you stroll along the path, admire the contrast of the pink blossoms against the yellow flowers (Nanohana) with the colorful Keikyū trains passing by in the background.

→ **11:30am –** Enjoy lunch on your own at the lively atmosphere of **Urari Marche**, a waterfront marketplace located at Misaki Port. This waterfront market is the best spot to grab fresh Misaki tuna and local snacks right by the pier.

→ **1:45pm –** Then, on to the **Komachi-dori shopping street**. Be sure to stop by Kamakura's famous cookie store for a sample. They're best known for their dove-shaped butter cookies, which make for a great Kamakura souvenir.

→ **3:45pm –** Next, a visit to the **Great Buddha at Kotokuin Temple**. This monumental bronze statue of Amida Buddha stands over 38 feet tall, making it the 2nd tallest bronze Buddha in Japan. Despite the intricate detail of its draped bronze garments, the statue has stood in the open air since 1495, having survived a series of natural disasters. Today, it is recognized as one of Japan's most iconic National Treasures. For a small fee, visitors are welcome to enter inside the Buddha to witness the sophisticated 13th-century casting techniques.

→ **5:30pm –** Return to hotel. Enjoy the evening of shopping and dining on your own.

Day 7: (Wed) Feb 17 – Yokohama-Haneda-Honolulu (B)

→ **Breakfast at hotel.**

→ **9:45am – Meet your guide at the hotel lobby for Yokohama & Haneda.**

→ **10:00am –** Begin our day at the iconic **Yokohama Red Brick Warehouse**, a historic shipping hub beautifully repurposed into a community space. We arrive just in time for the **Yokohama Strawberry Festival!** Have fun shopping and snacking at various stalls while surrounded by the sweet aroma of strawberries.

→ **11:15am –** Next up: the immersive digital world of **Wonderia Yokohama**, which opened in March 2026. Featuring six themed zones, it blends high-resolution nature and urban visuals with interactive tech for a "teamLab-style" experience that allows visitors to explore ecosystems like the deep sea and primeval forests.

→ **1:30pm –** Calling all ramen lovers! Prepare to step back in time at the **Shin-Yokohama Ramen Museum**, the world's first ramen-themed amusement park. Beneath the surface lies a stunning, atmospheric replica of 1950s Tokyo, complete with neon-lit alleys and retro storefronts. Explore various shops, each serving regional specialties from across Japan. Between bowls, you can discover the fascinating history of ramen and its rise to global stardom.

→ **3:00pm –** Check off your omiyage list at **Tressa Yokohama**, a large shopping mall and entertainment complex inspired by the architecture of Lyon, France, giving your shopping spree a European touch. It is also home to the Kanto region's first auto mall, where visitors can view and interact with the latest Toyota cars.

→ **Transfer to Haneda Airport to begin our check-in process for the flight home.**

→ **Arrive in Honolulu (same day).**
